The monument known as Cul a'Chleit, standing stones, Garynahine comprises two standing stones set on a rocky knoll, plus large slabs which probably represent fallen stones of a larger setting. The area to be scheduled is a square, aligned N-S of side 50m, to include the two standing and two fallen stones and an area around them in which further stones or other structural remains may lie concealed. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Uig and the County of Ross and Cromarty as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

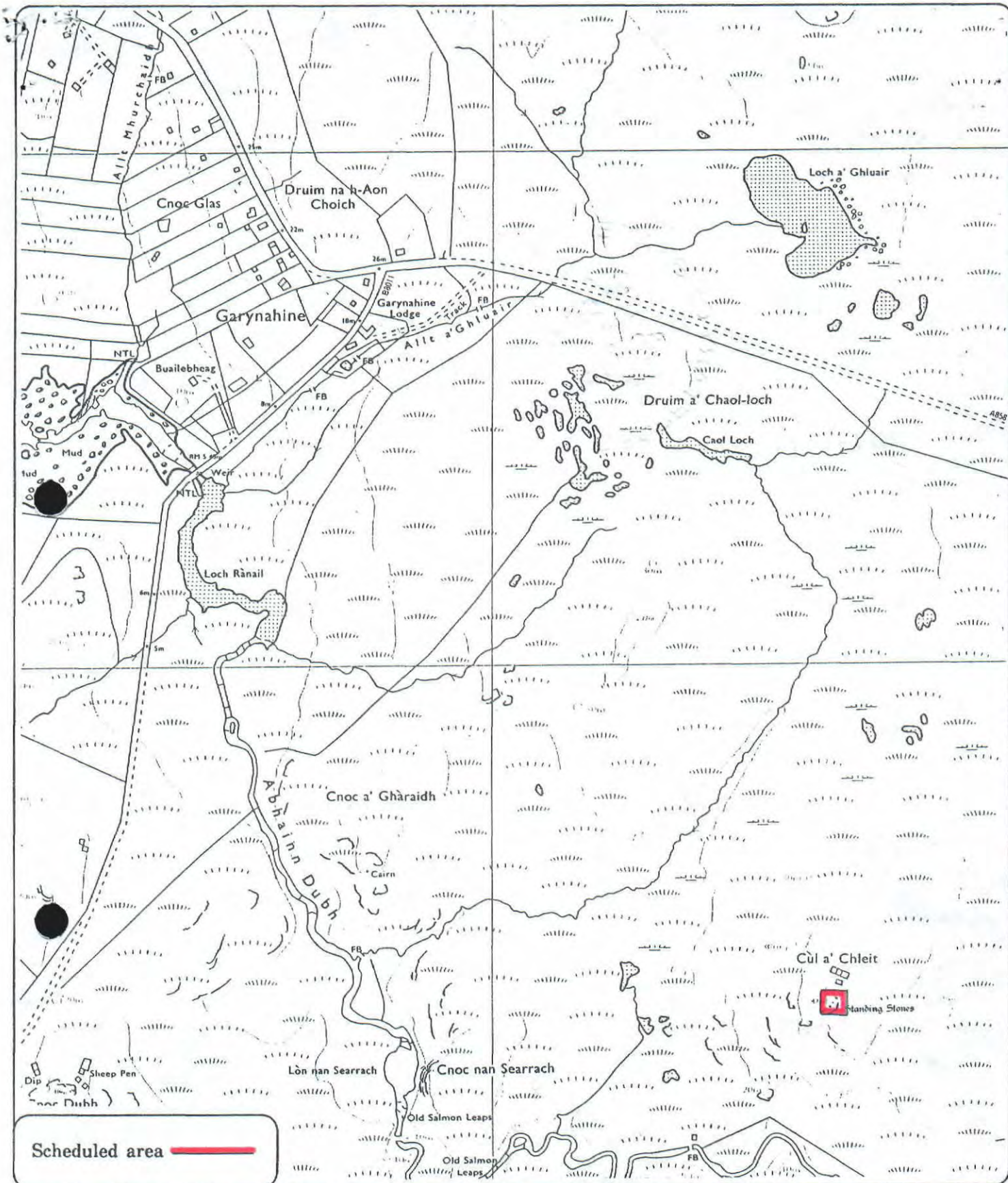
