The monument known as Upper Corskie, stone circle and Pictish symbols 530m SE of comprises the remains of a stone circle of the prehistoric period, probably of the Later Neolithic or Bronze Age, with later, Pictish symbols incised upon on one stone. It stands on the slope to the N of the Corskie Burn. The area to be scheduled is a circle 40m in diameter centred on the remains of the stone circle to include the stone circle and an area around and between the two standing stones in which further remains associated with the construction and use of the stone circle may survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Echt and the County of Aberdeen as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

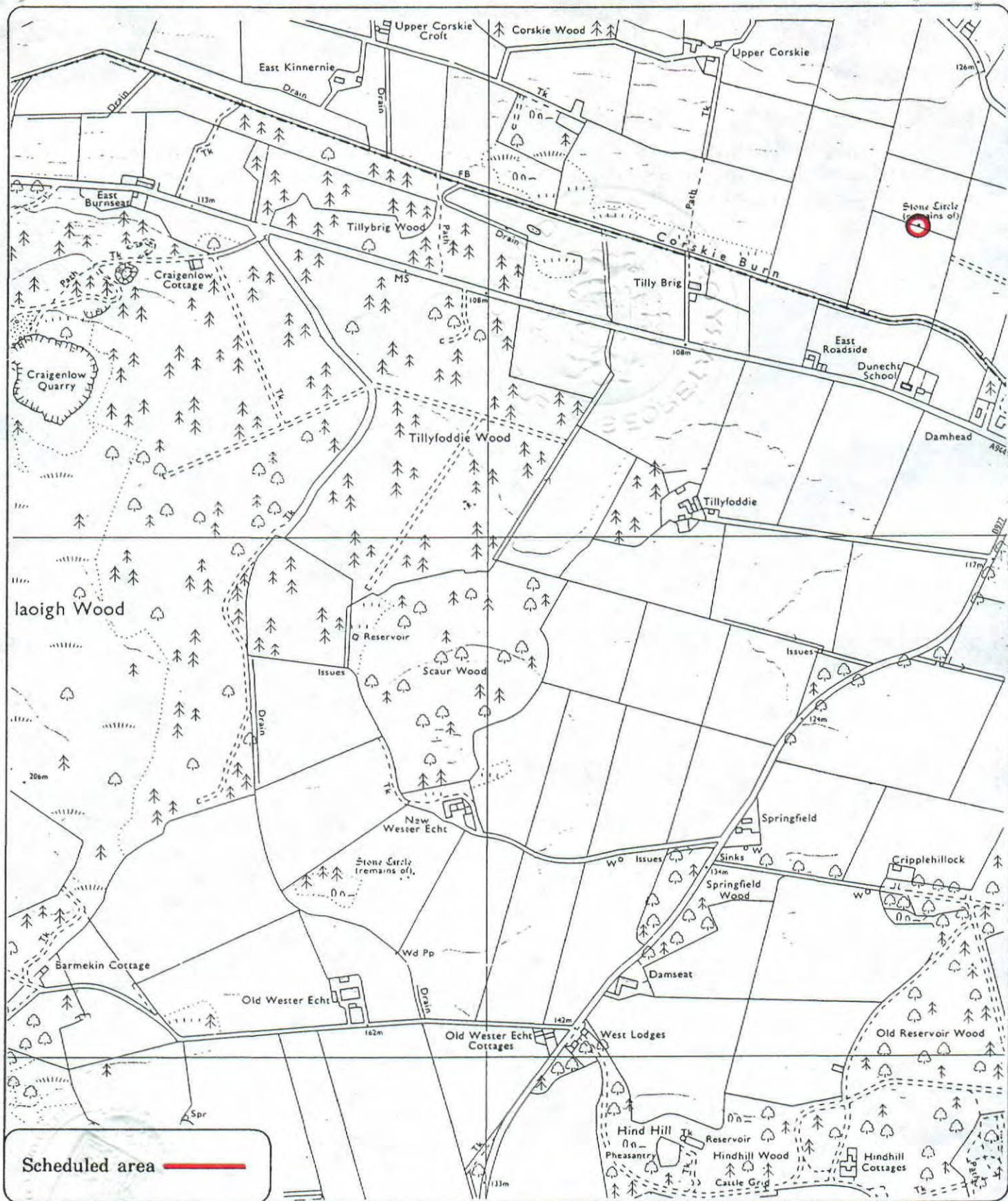
