THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Summerlee Iron Works, furnaces, furnace bank and associated works comprises the remains of an iron works founded in 1836. The main features of the monument are the remains of 3 blast furnaces, with their associated hot-blast stoves, the blowing engine houses together with the linked boiler settings and bases of chimneys, together with the furnace bank, pig-casting beds and canal wharf area associated with the working of the furnaces. The area to be scheduled is irregular, including all of the aforementioned features but excluding the boatbuilding shed and the modern adaptations of the furnace bank. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Coatbridge and the County of Lanark as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and
