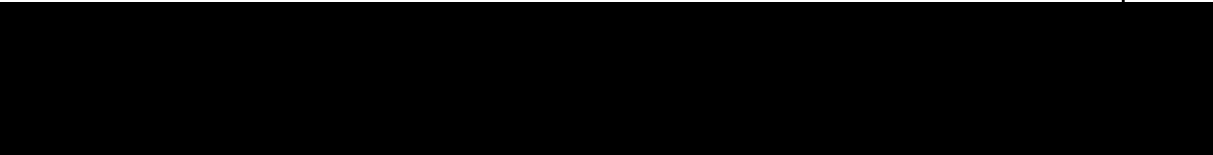

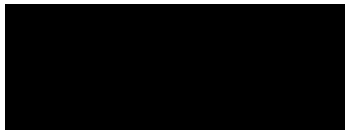

ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Corston Hill, cairn comprises the remains of a burial cairn of Later Neolithic or Bronze Age date surviving as a grassed-over stony mound. The area to be scheduled encompasses the cairn and an area around it in which traces of associated ritual activity may be expected to survive. It is circular with a diameter of 40m. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Kirknewton and the County of Midlothian as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of



is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

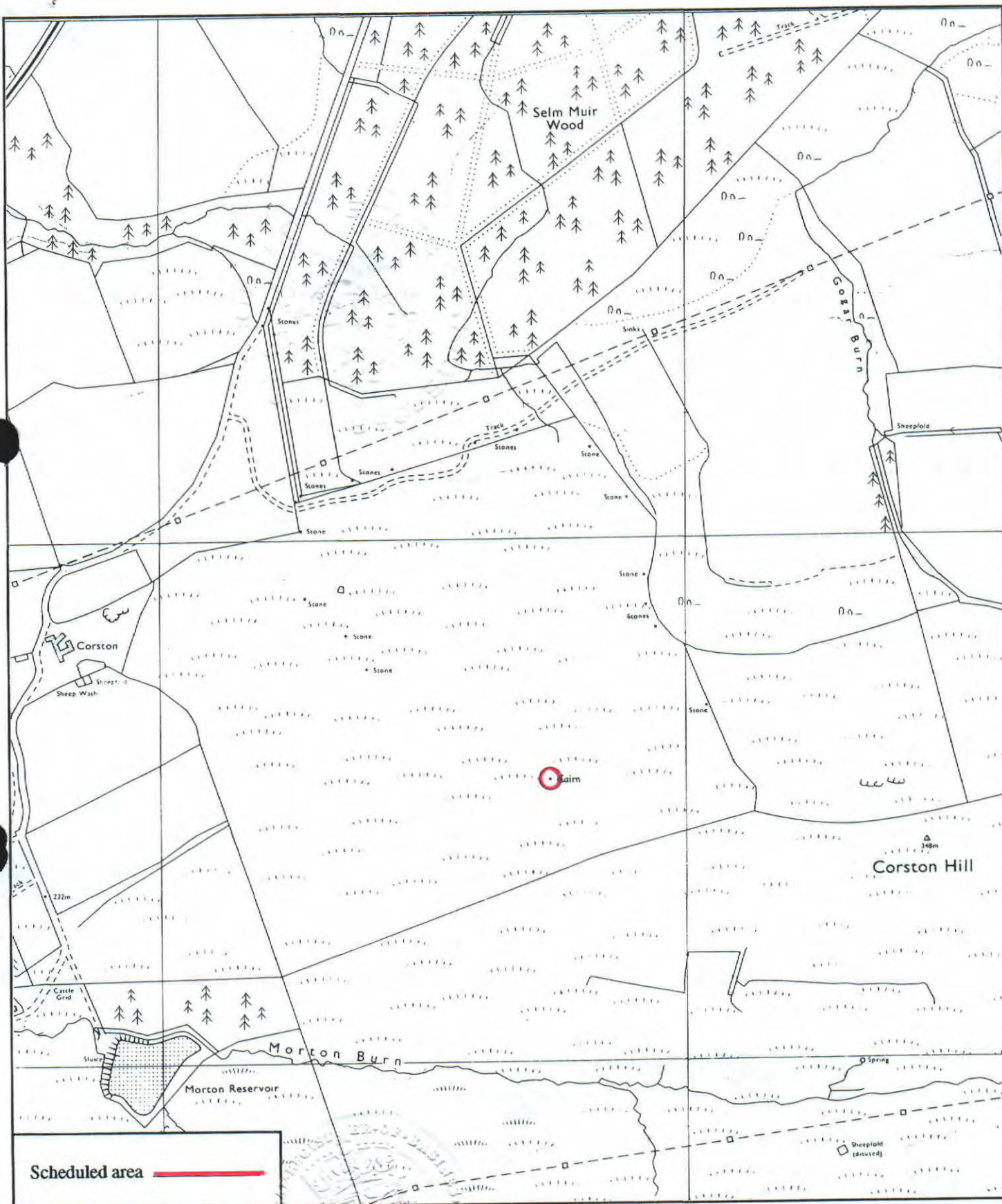
