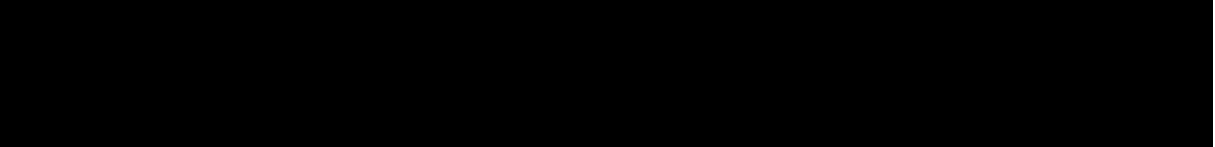

ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Loch an Duin, dun and causeways, Scalpay comprises of the remains of a dun, a fortified island dwelling of Iron Age or medieval date, together with the remains of two causeways which formerly linked it to the shore and to another small island. The area to be scheduled is irregular on plan, measuring some 125m E-W by a maximum of 60m N-S, to include the two islands and causeways, and an area of the floor of the loch around them, on and in which evidence relating to the construction and use of the dun and causeways may survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Harris and the County of Inverness as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto



is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

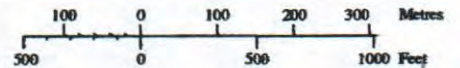
