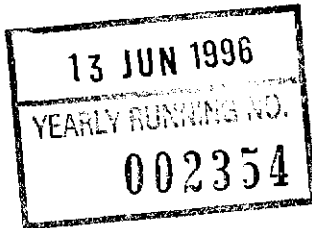



THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979  
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Elphinstone Tower, towerhouse comprises the remains of a late fifteenth century towerhouse. The area to be scheduled is rectangular, 20m E-W by 16m N—S, to include the tower and an area around in which evidence relating to its construction and use may survive. The above-ground portion of the boundary wall to the immediate S of the tower is excluded from this scheduling. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Tranent and the County of East Lothian as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

 is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.



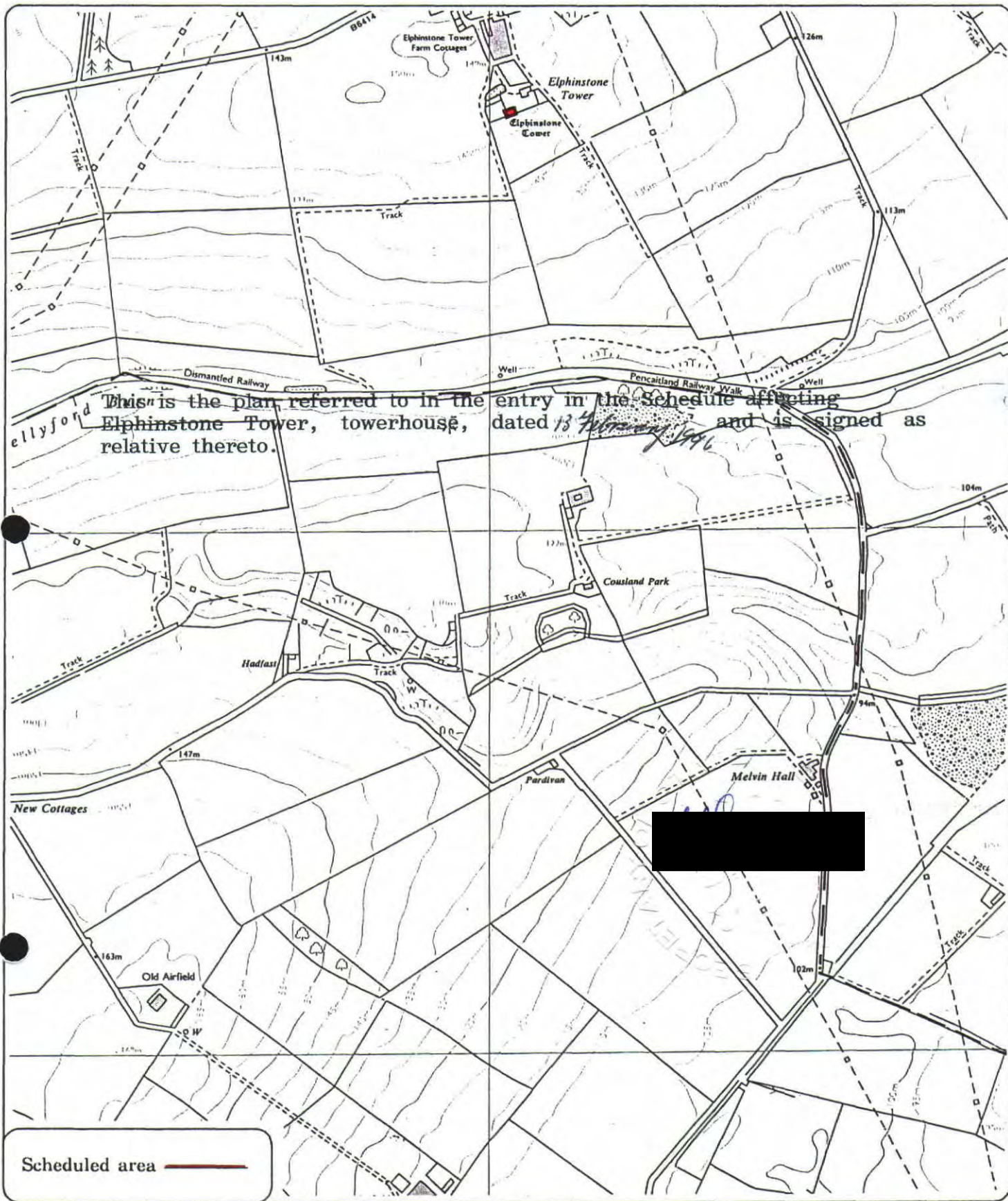

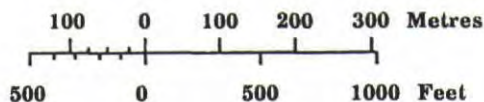
Elphinstone Tower, towerhouse
