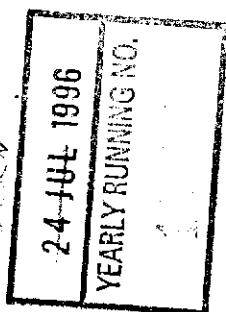

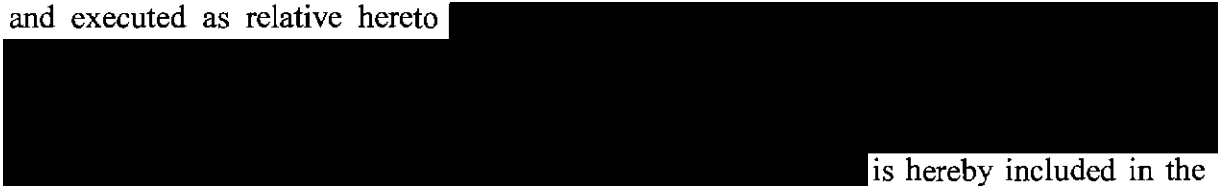

ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Inchbare, cursus NE of comprises the remains of a cursus of Neolithic date represented by cropmarks visible on oblique aerial photographs. The area to be scheduled encompasses the remains described above and an area around them in which traces of associated material may be expected to survive. It is irregular on plan with maximum dimensions of 370m WSW-ENE by 100m. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Stracathro and the County of Angus as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto



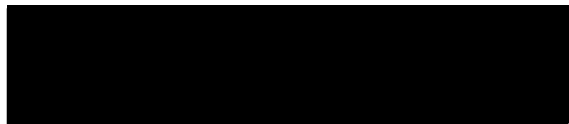

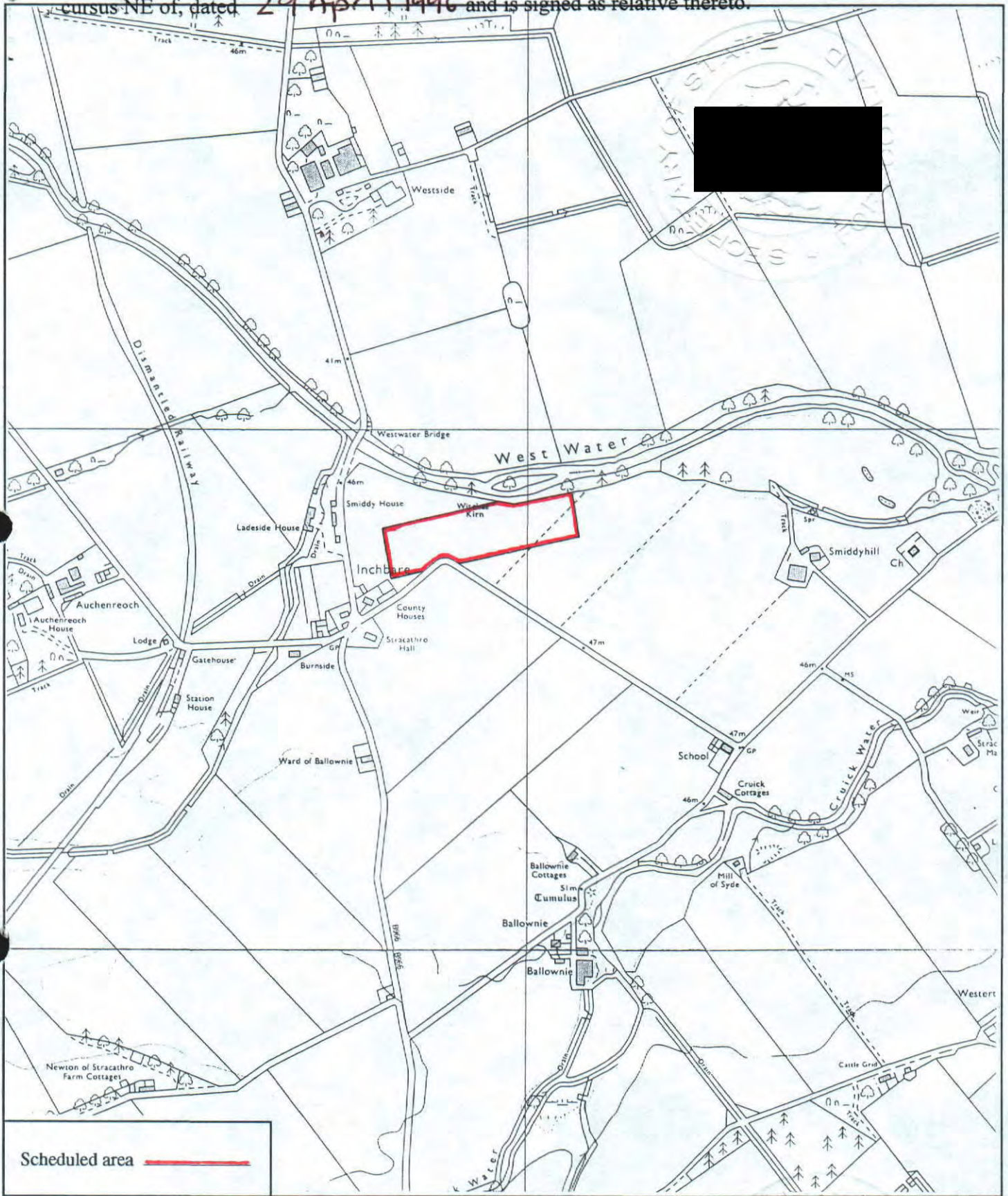
