

ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Loch Lomond, crannog 200m WSW of Mill of Ross, comprises the remains of a crannog, or lake dwelling, of prehistoric date. The area to be scheduled encompasses the normally submerged remains and an area of the loch bed around them in which traces of associated activity may be expected to survive. It is circular with a diameter of 60m. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Buchanan and the County of Stirling as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms

 is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

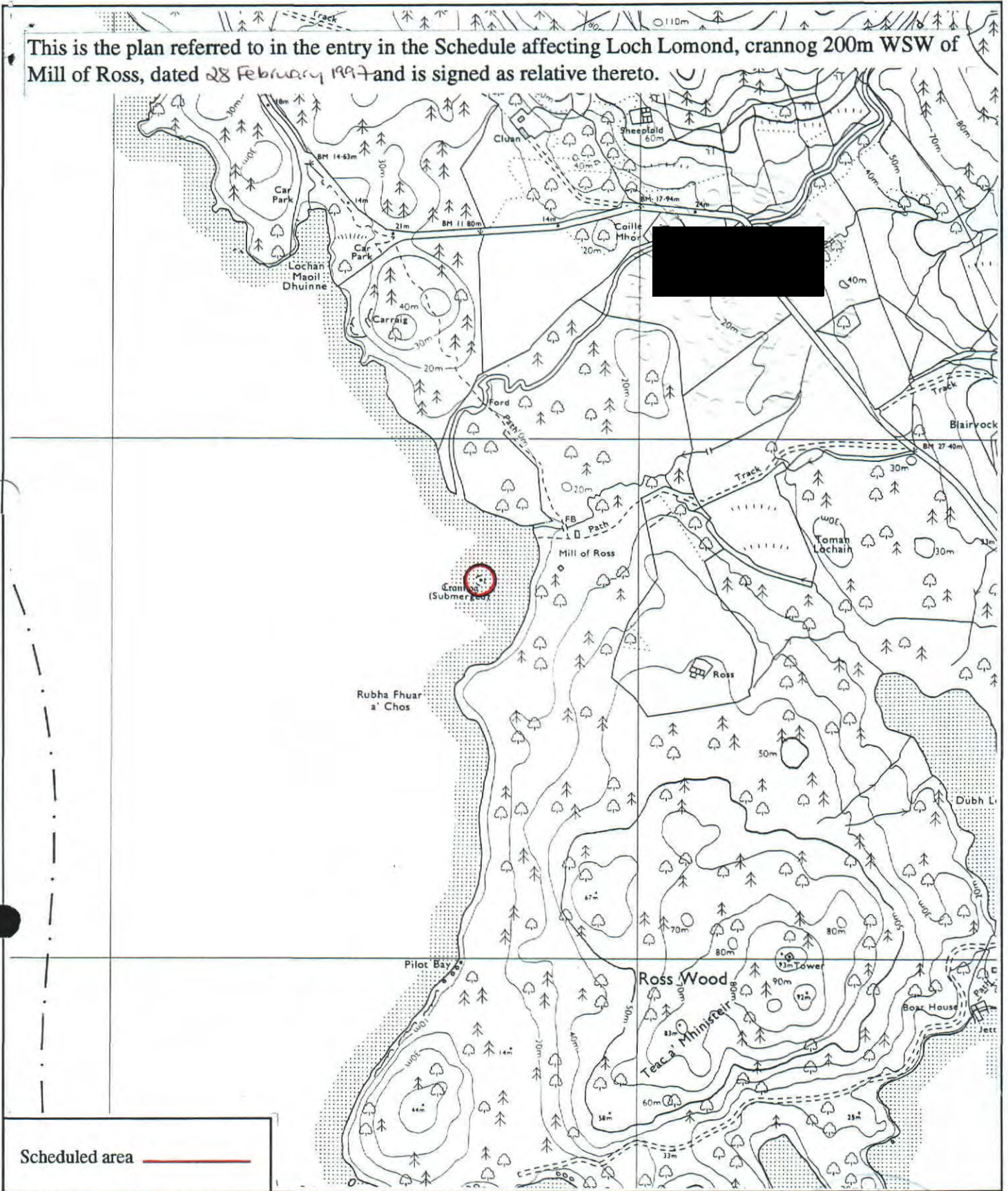
