

ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Forth and Clyde Canal: Bowling-Old Kilpatrick comprises that length of waterway forming part of the Forth and Clyde Canal falling within the boundary of the civil parish of Old Kilpatrick and the boundary of Dumbarton District. The length of the monument is approximately 700m and runs from Bowling Harbour (on the west) to the western edge of Old Kilpatrick (on the east). The monument includes the entire length of canal in water together with the banks on either side and the towing path running along one side. In addition, the monument includes the following canal structures: (1) the harbour walls, locks 39 and 40 and the lower canal basin at Bowling Harbour; (2) the bascule bridge immediately to the west of the upper canal basin, the upper canal basin itself and lock 38; (3) Tinkers Burn Aqueduct. The monument does not include the late 19th-century railway viaduct between the upper and lower canal basins, or existing (modern) fences and walls, but does include an area to either side of the area in water in which traces of activities associated with its construction and use may survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Dumbarton and the County of Dumbarton as shown outlined in red on the Plan

 is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

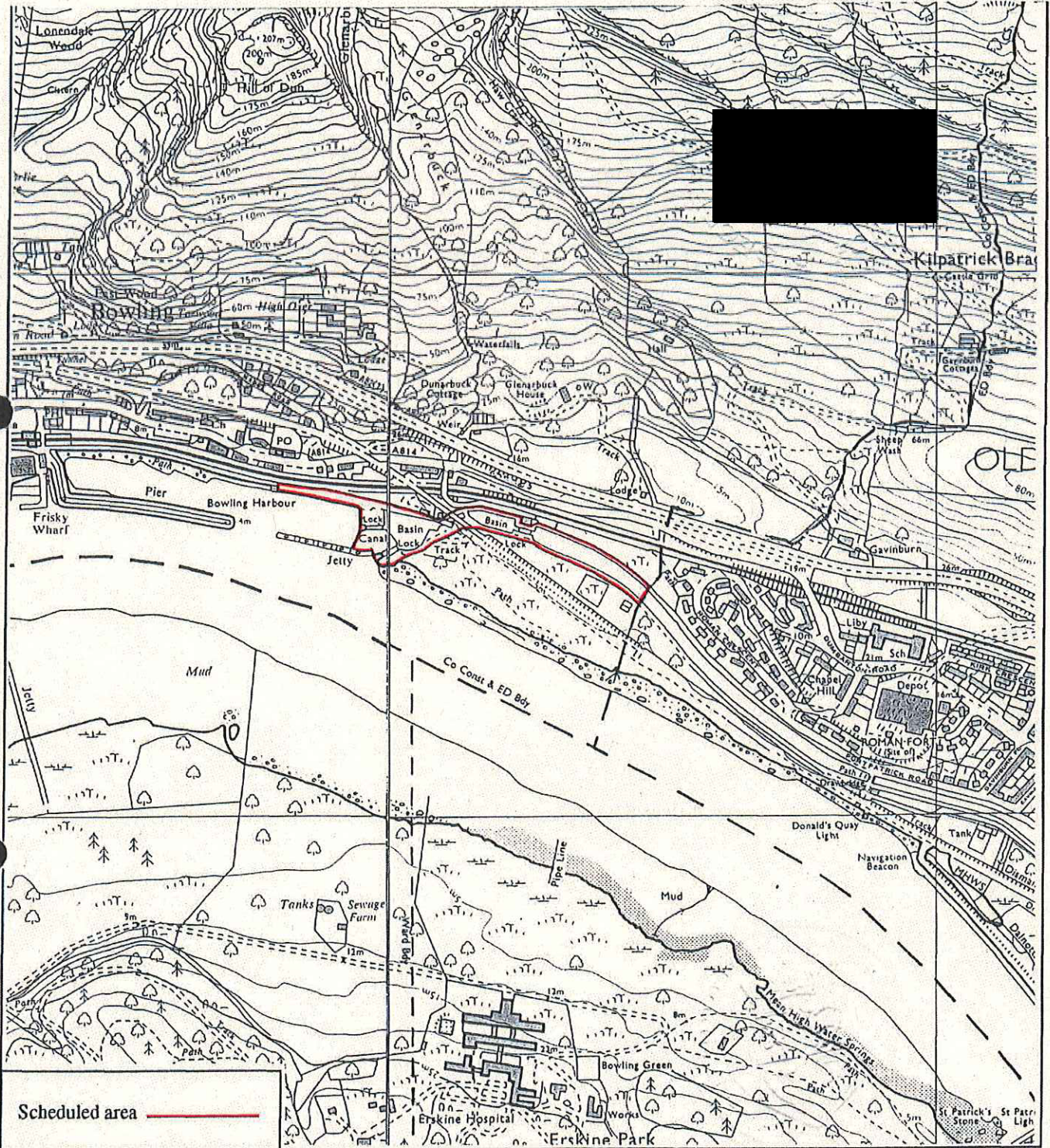

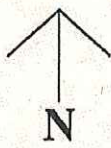

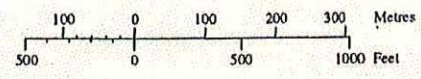
