ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Southdean Church comprises the remains of a medieval church and its kirkyard, situated at the roadside some 50m NW of Southdean. The area to be scheduled encompasses the church, the kirkyard and its associated funerary monuments. The area is four sided, with maximum dimensions of 40m NW to SE and 40m NE to SW. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Southdean and the County of Roxburgh as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

[redacted] is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

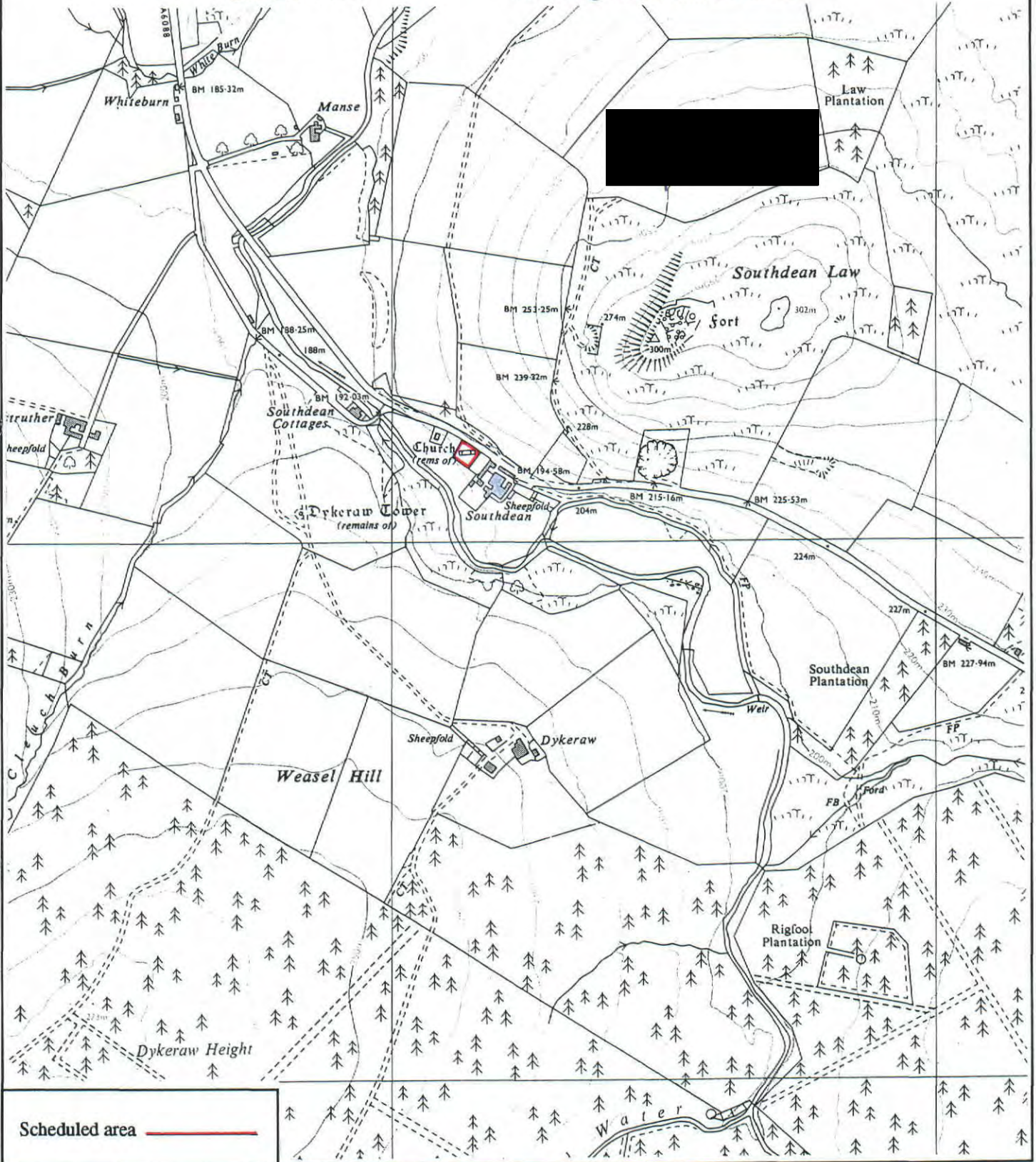

Scheduled area

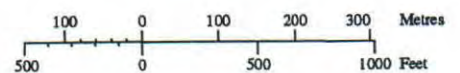
Southdean Church
