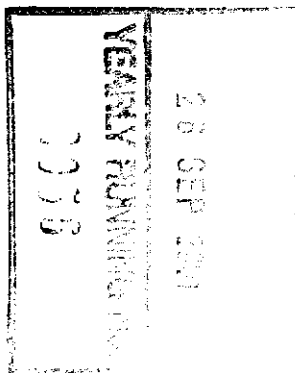

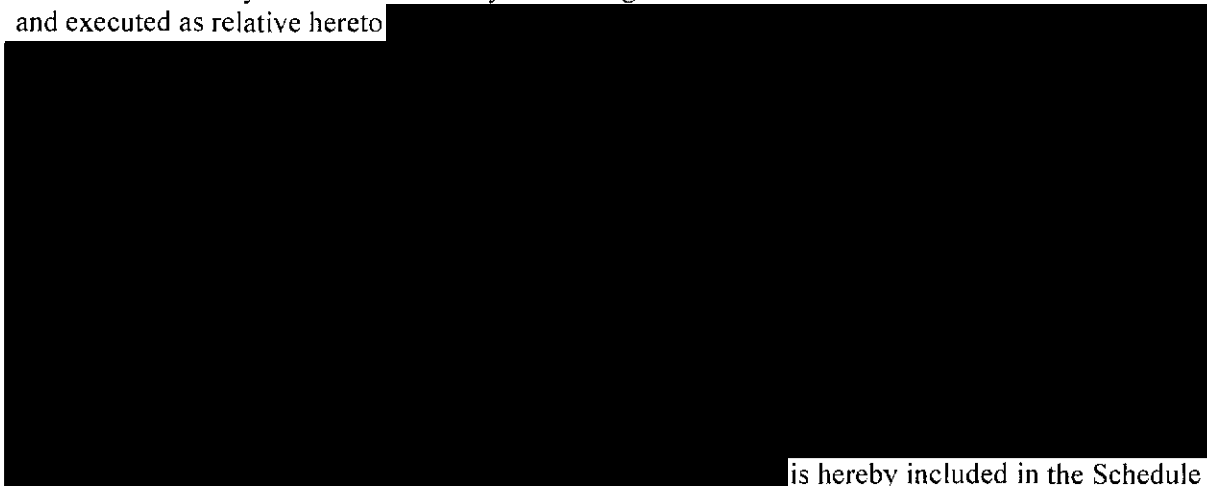

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Drumquhassle, Roman fort and annexe 300m NNW of Easter Drumquhassle comprises the remains of a Roman fort with an annexe, constructed in the 1st century AD and represented by cropmarks visible on oblique aerial photographs. The area to be scheduled encompasses the fort and related remains, and an area around them in which traces of associated activity may be expected to survive. There are five separate areas, extending overall to a maximum of about 425m from the westernmost to the easternmost point, and about 385m from the northernmost to the southernmost point. The northwestern boundary is defined according to a careful resurvey of the edges of the extant planning permission and/or current quarry edge (where it has exceeded the area for which planning permission had been given). The monument, which lies in the Parish of Drymen and the County of Stirling as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

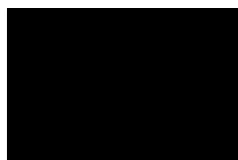

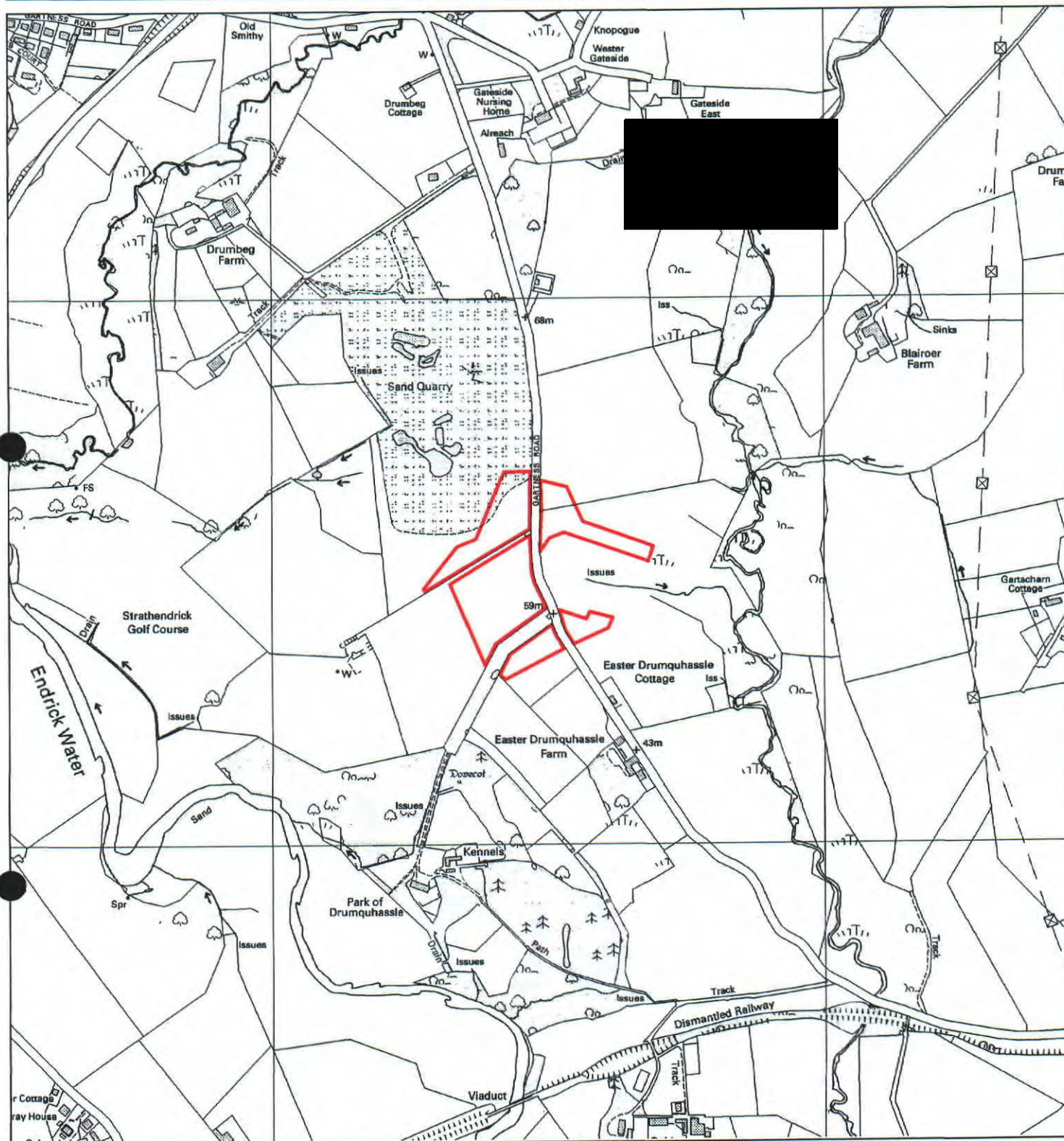
