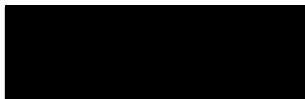

The monument known as Loch Dochart, castle comprises the remains of a small rubble-built fortified house and associated ancillary buildings on an island in Loch Dochart. The house was probably of only two principal floors, with a hall and a chamber above a kitchen and other offices, and with a garret in the roof space. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Killin and the County of Perth as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

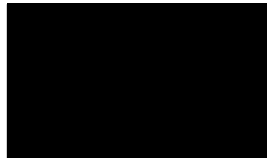

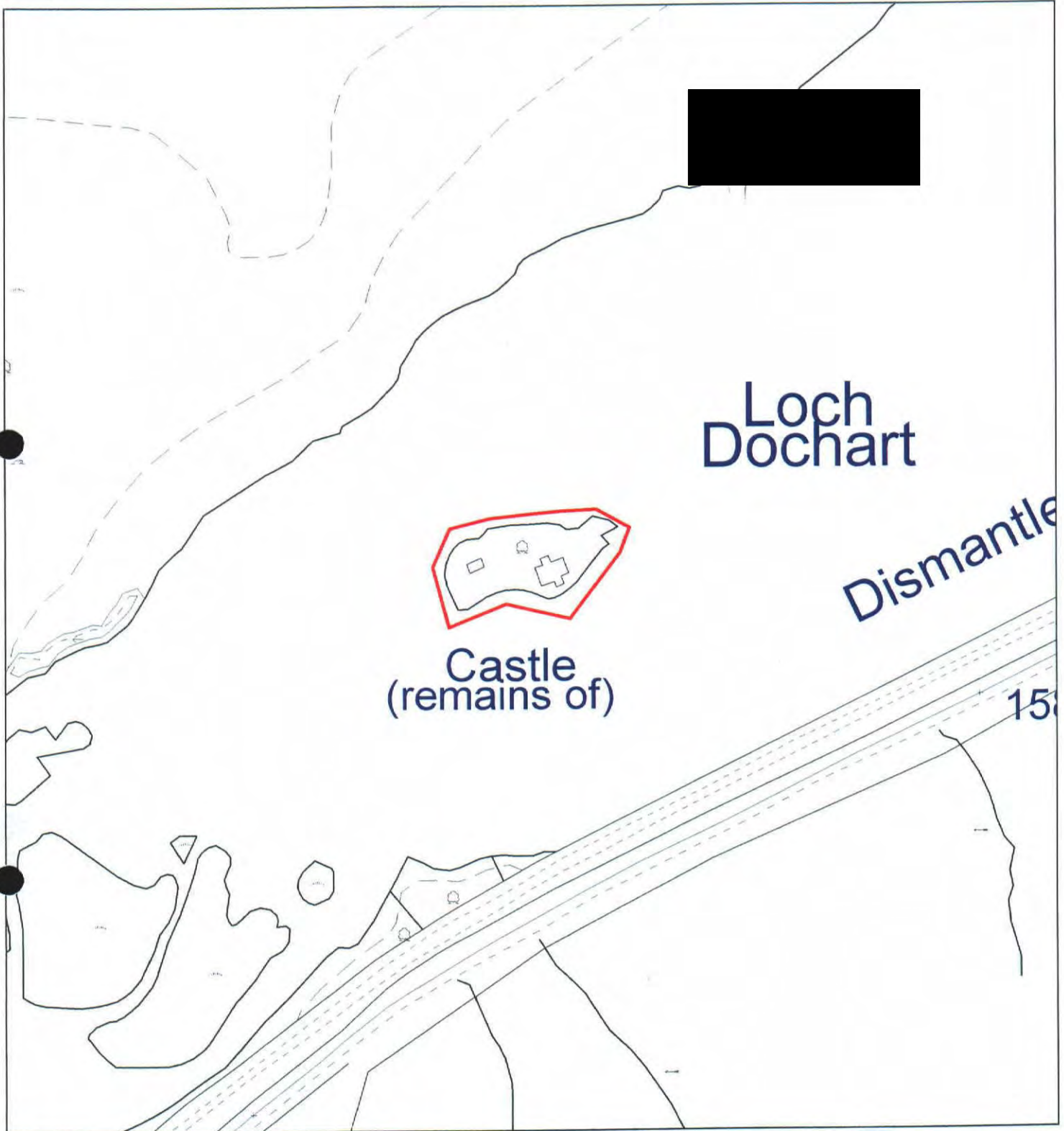
