

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Rait Hill, fort, comprises a promontory fort of prehistoric date, visible as an upstanding earthwork. The area to be scheduled comprises the remains described and an area around them within which related material may be expected to be found. It is kite-shaped, measuring 80m E-W by 70m N-S. The scheduled area is bounded by the fence marking the edge of the woodland, which is itself excluded from the scheduling. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Kilspindie and the County of Perth as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto



is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

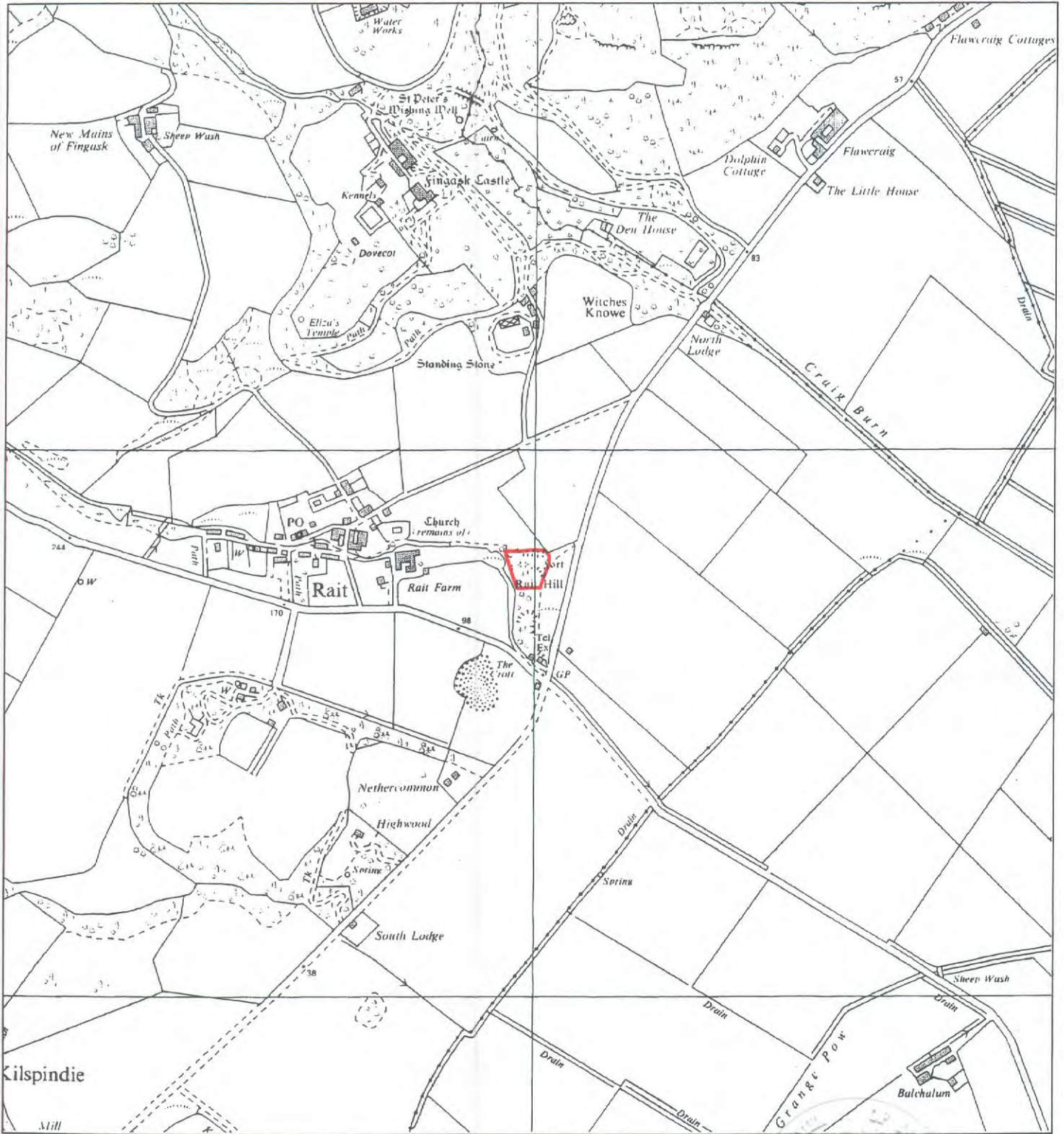
