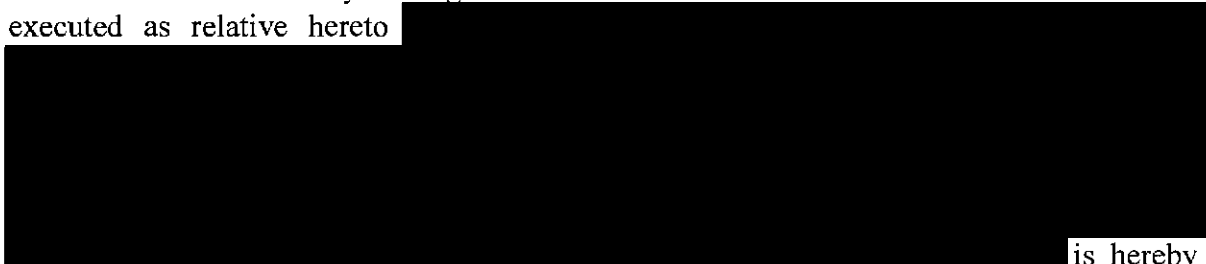

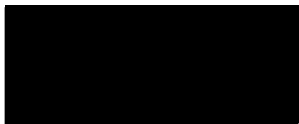
THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Milton of Larg, corn mill 810m SSW of, comprises a corn mill of early post-Medieval date, visible as an upstanding building. The area to be scheduled comprises the remains described and an area around them within which related material may be expected to be found. It is a truncated circle on plan, with maximum diameter of 50m, bounded on the SE and SW by the burn. The monument, which lies in the Parish of New Luce and the County of Wigtown as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto



is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

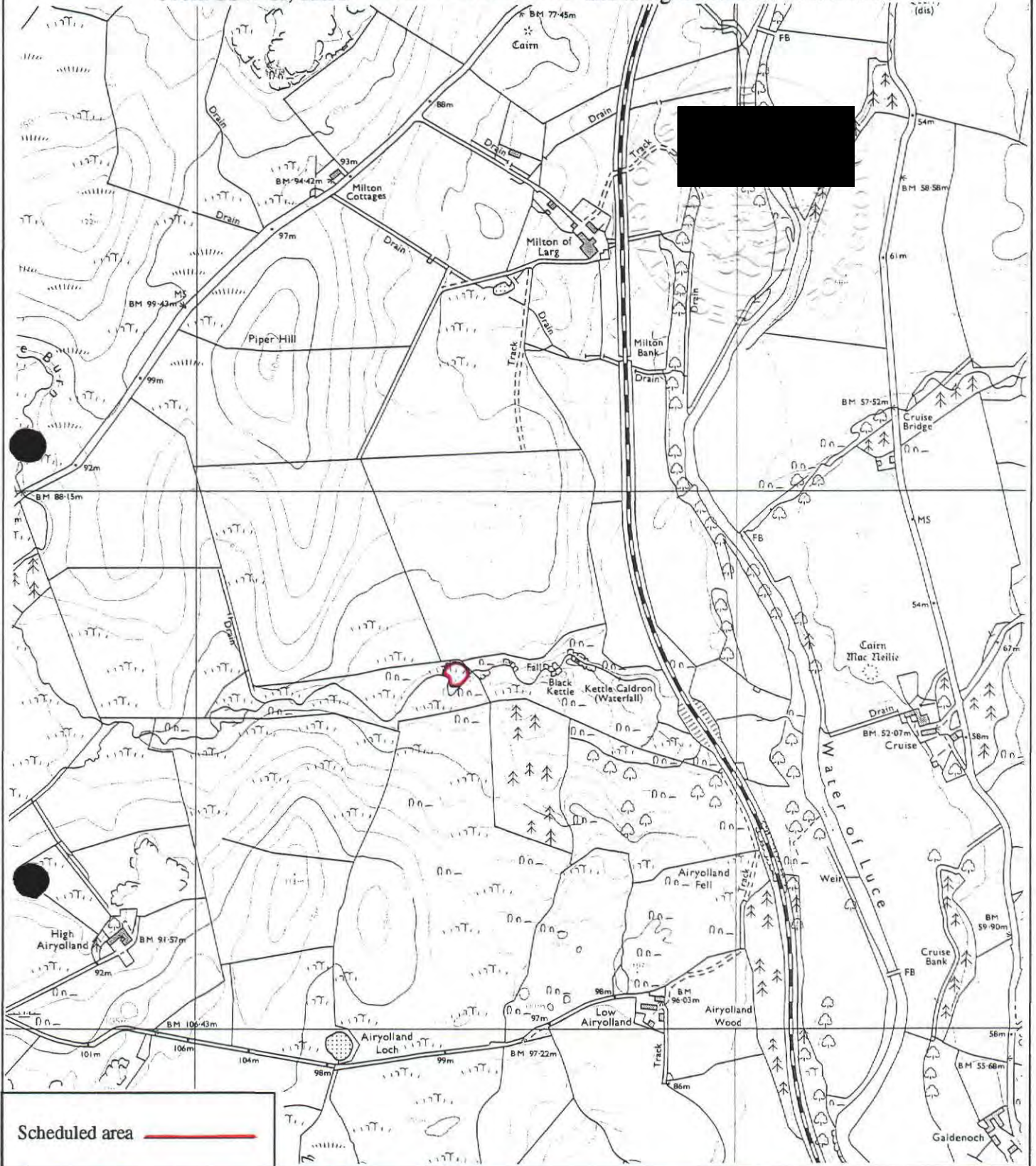

Scheduled area

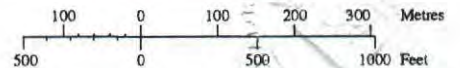
Milton of Larg, corn mill 810m SSW of
