ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Portabhata, depopulated settlement, comprises a depopulated agricultural township of post-medieval date. The area to be scheduled comprises the remains of the township as described and an area around them in which evidence relating to the construction and occupation of the site is likely to survive. It is irregular, measuring a maximum of 210m NNW-SSE and 220m WNW-ESE. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Morvern and the County of Argyll as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto [REDACTED]

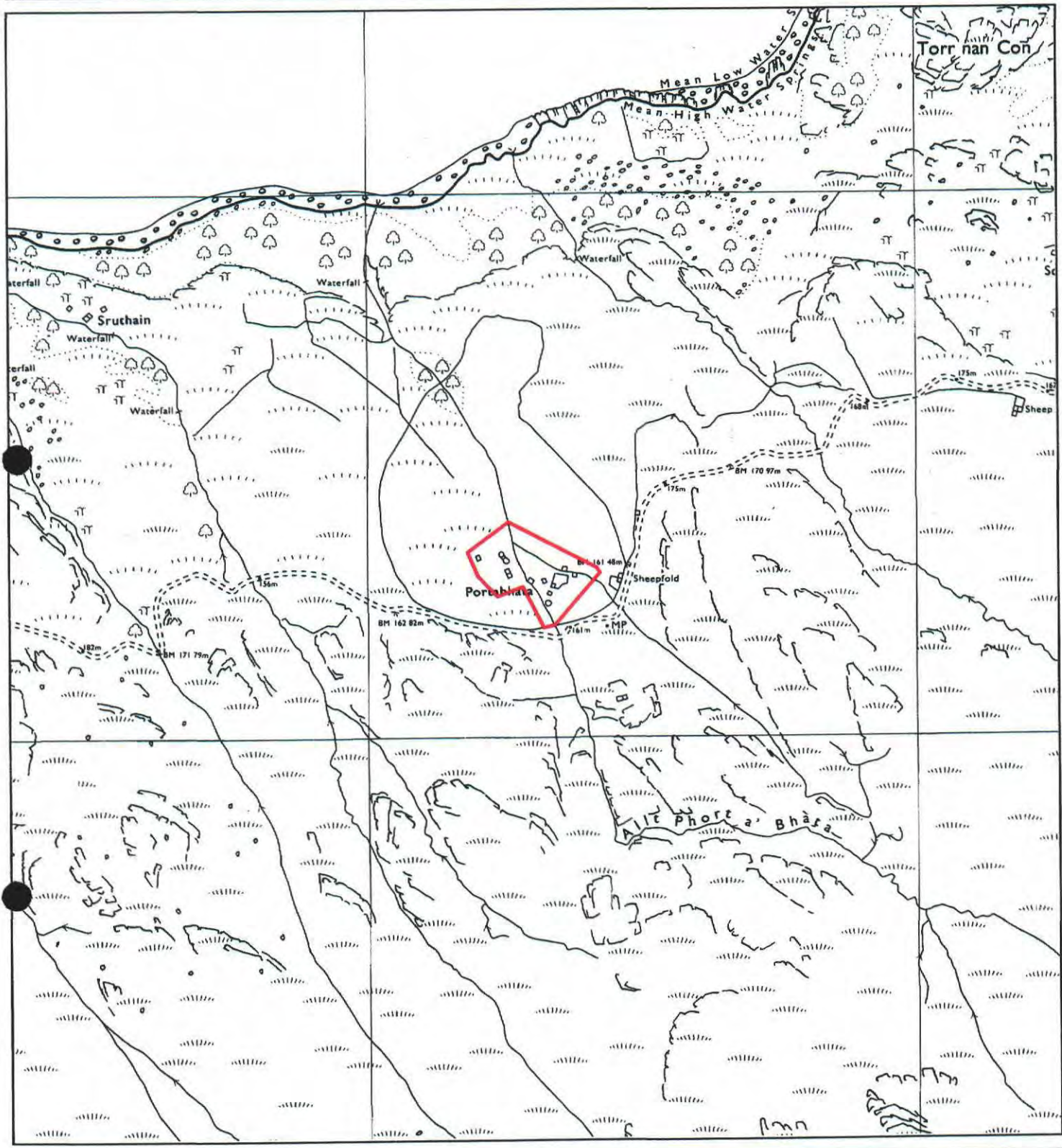
