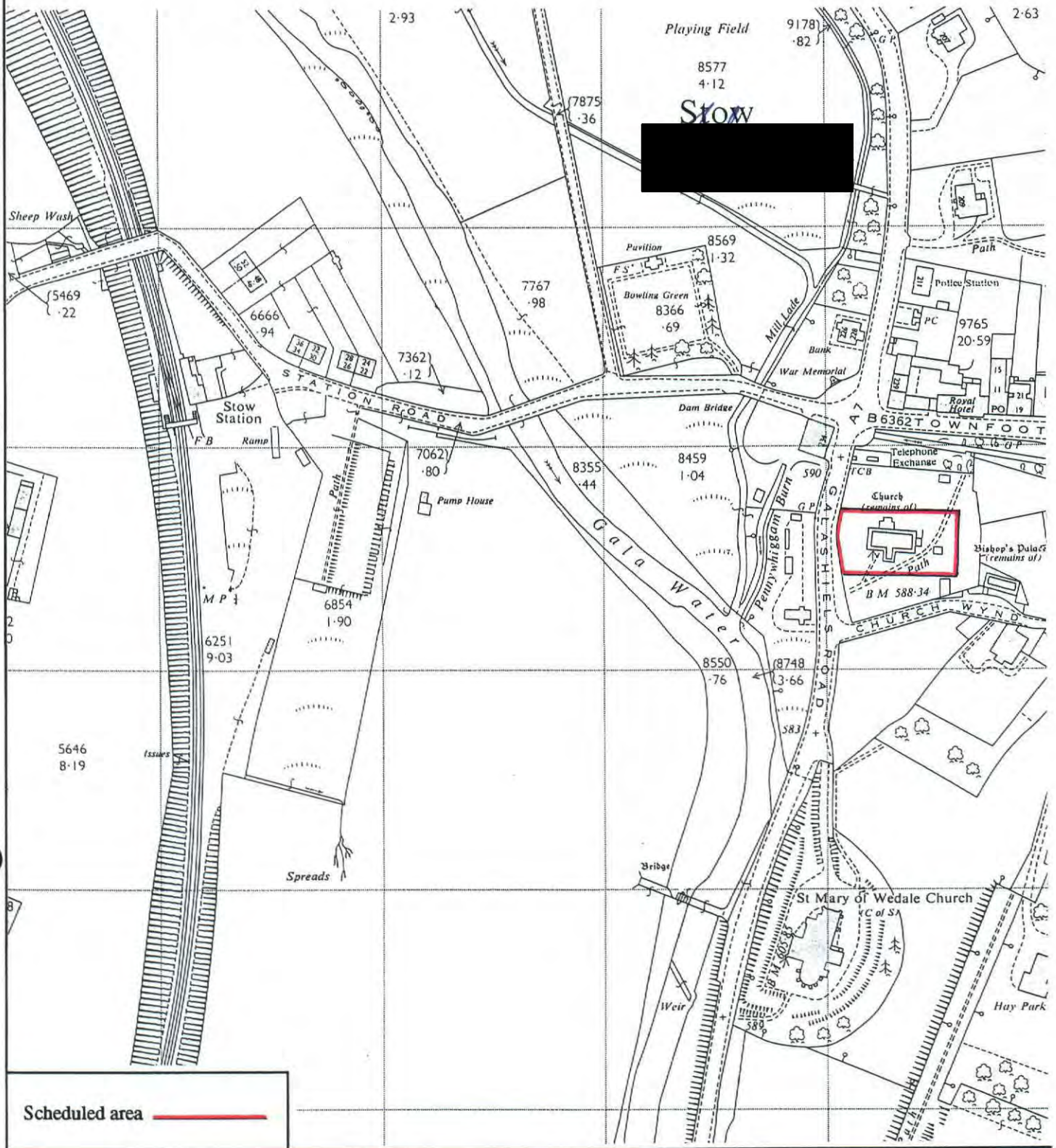
The monument known as St Mary's Church, Stow comprises the remains of the parish church of Stow, dedicated to St Mary. The area to be scheduled is irregular on plan, measuring a maximum of 55m E-W by 30m N-S and includes an area around the church which is likely to include archaeological deposits associated with the church. Excluded from the scheduling are all post-Reformation gravestones and any burial lairs with existing burial rights. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Stow and the County of Midlothian as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

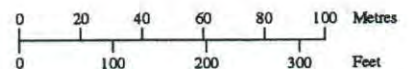
St Mary's Church, Stow
