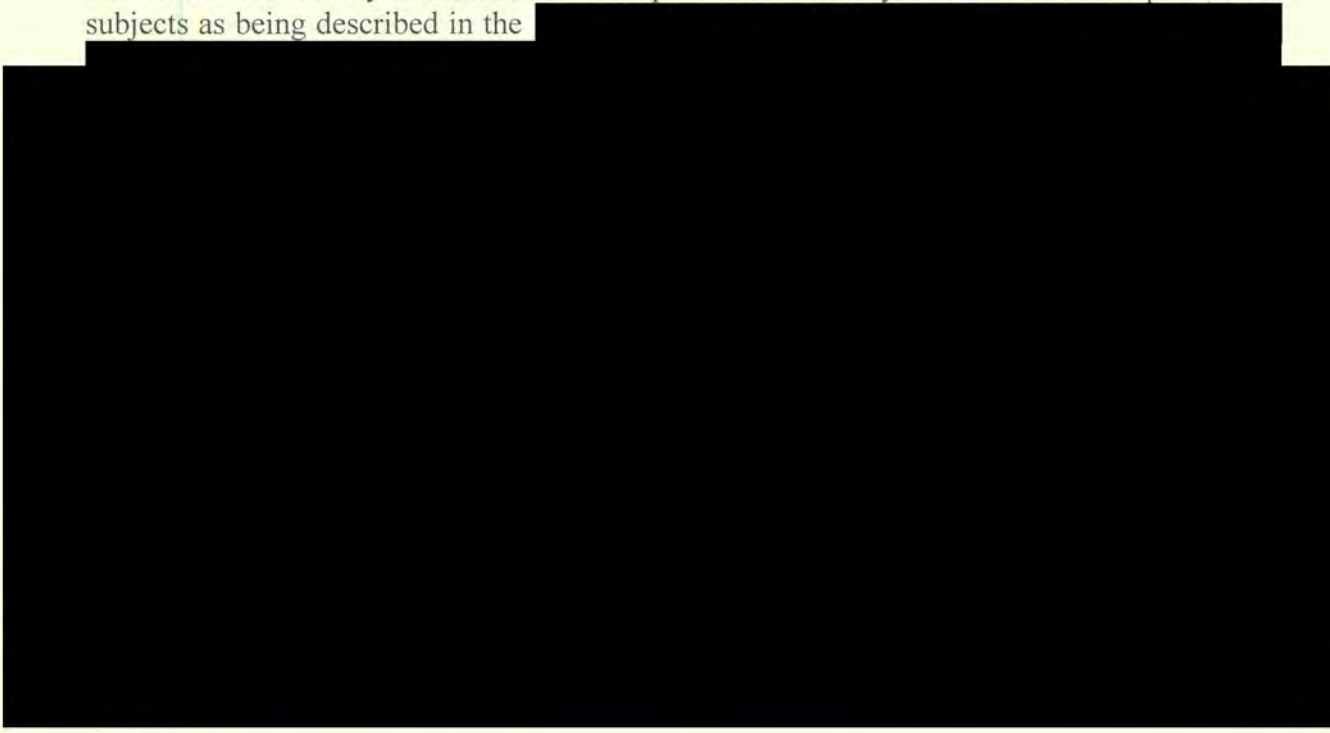

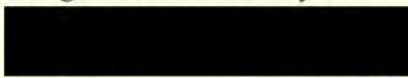

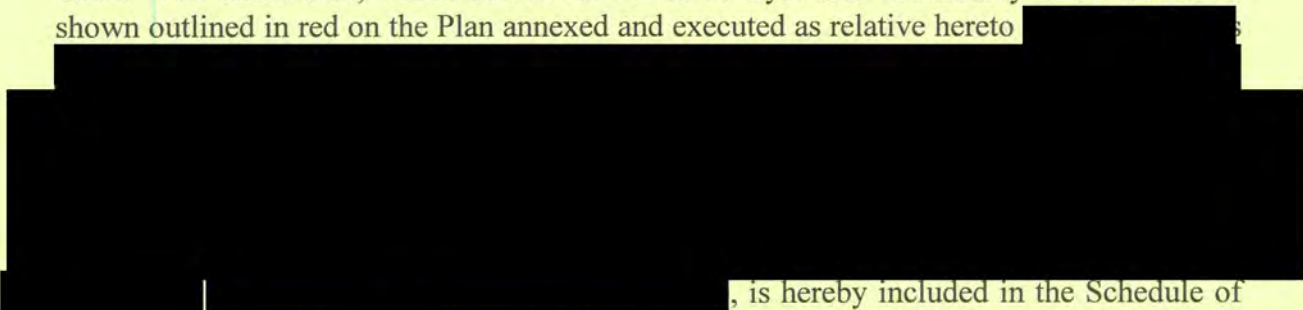

ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Aberdeenshire Canal, remains of, Beidleston to Woodland's Wood comprises the remains of a stretch of the Aberdeenshire Canal Navigation, or Aberdeen-Inverurie Canal. The area to be scheduled comprises a strip of land some 30m-40m wide and 1460m in length, including the canal bed, embankments and scarp. It extends from the break in natural slope on the S to the foot of the bank on the N, and from a stone dyke at its western extremity to a gated fence at its eastern. The fenced railway property is excluded from the scheduling, as is the top 15cm of the track to Woodlands Croft. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Dyce and the County of Aberdeen as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

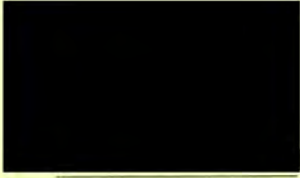

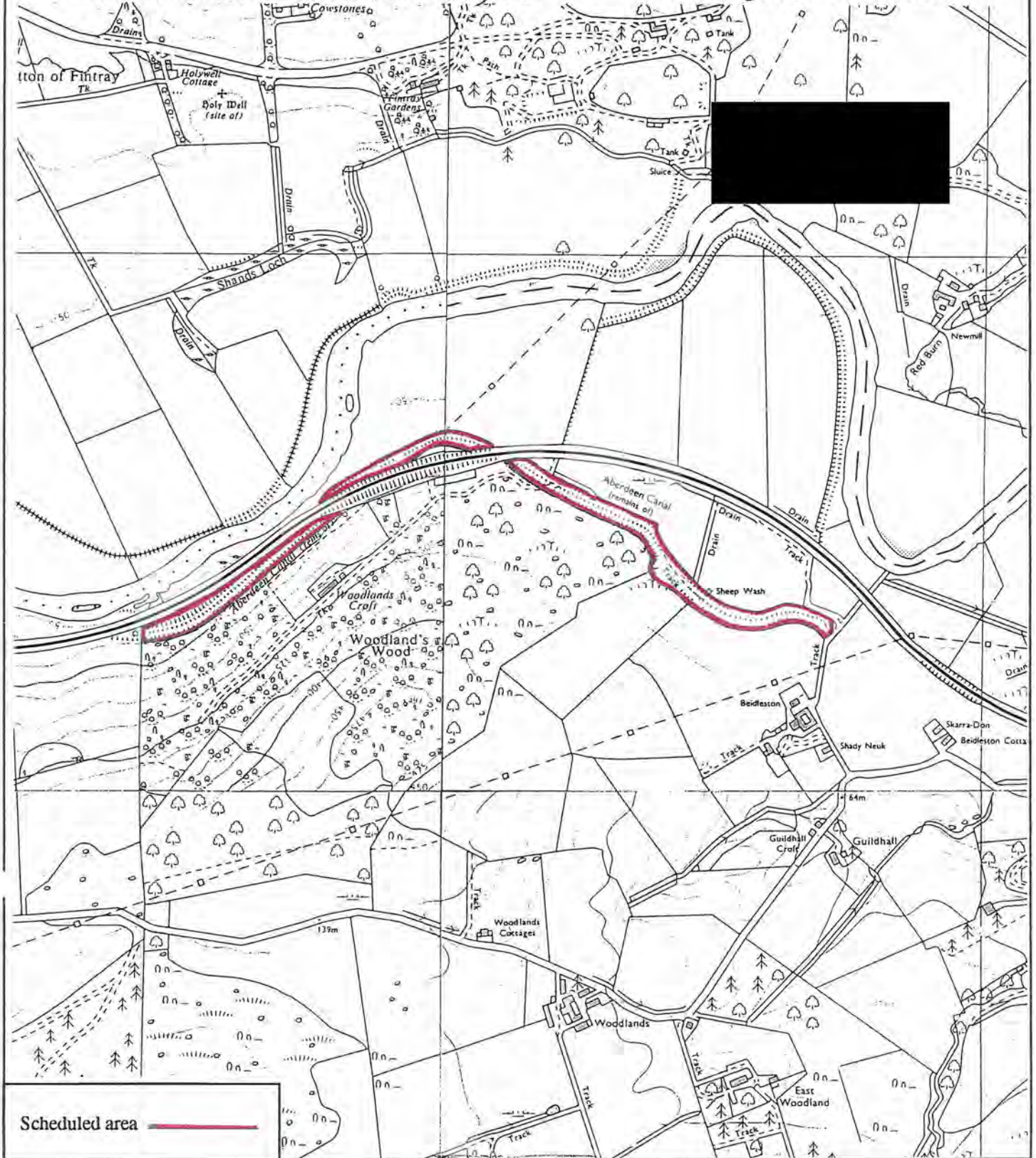

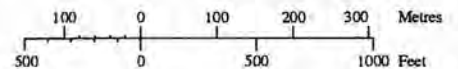
**Aberdeenshire Canal, remains of,
