ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Dalton, old parish church consists of the remains of Dalton old parish church, alternatively known as Mickle Dalton, Dalton Magna and Meikle Dalton, is situated on rising ground 40m to the SE of the present parish church of Dalton, which was built in 1895. The area to be scheduled includes the church and an area around it, in which associated archaeology can be expected to be found. All modern burial lairs still in use, within and without the church, are excluded from the scheduling. The area to be scheduled is rectangular with maximum dimensions of 40m NE-SW and 30m transversely. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Dalton and the County of Dumfries as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto [REDACTED]

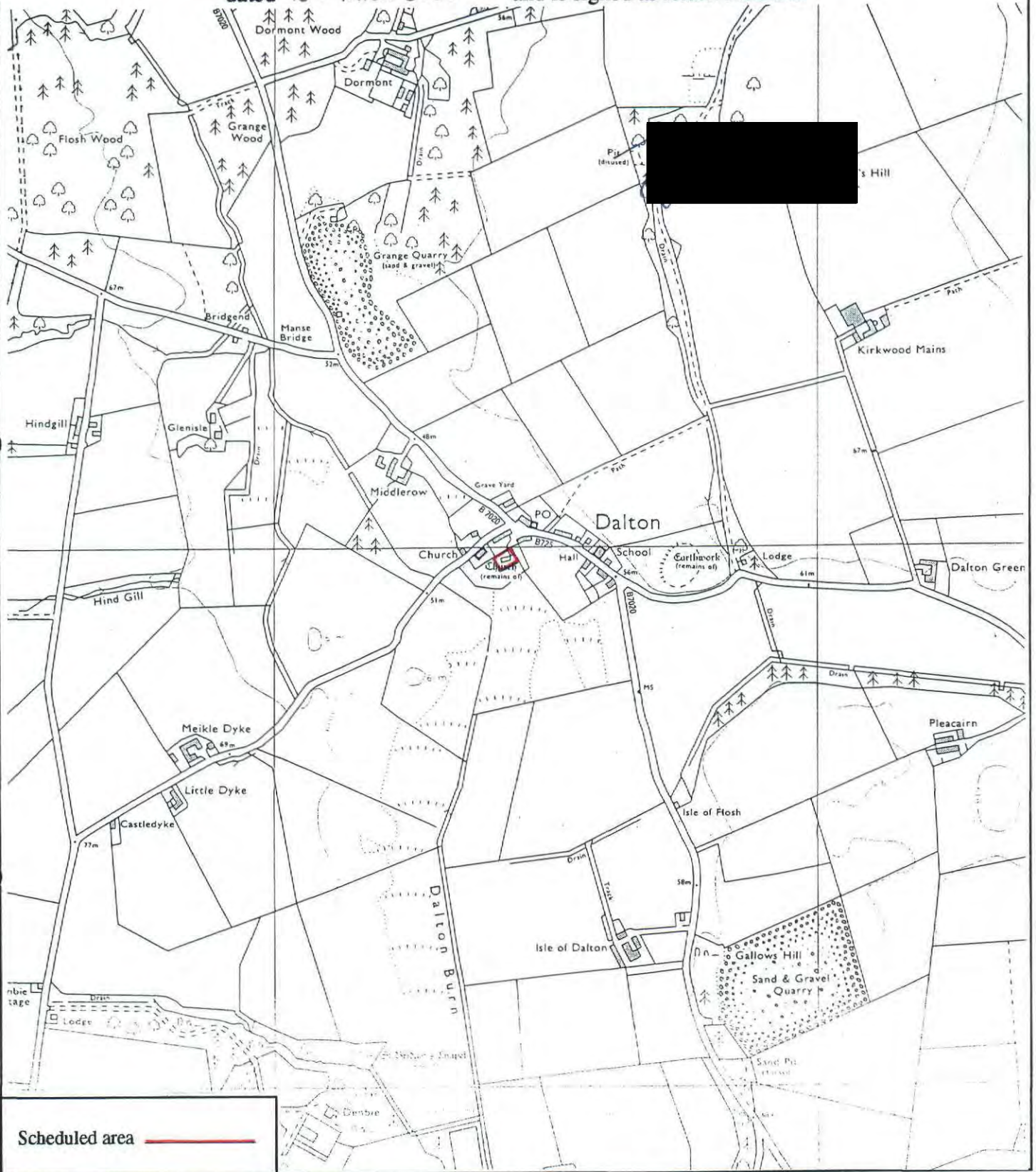

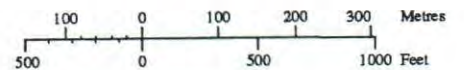
Dalton, old parish church
