ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Inveruglas Castle, Inveruglas Isle, Loch Lomond consists of the remains of a Z-plan tower situated on Inveruglas Isle, off the west shore of Loch Lomond. On the island, there are also the remains of a substantial jetty and other buildings which may be associated with the castle. The area to be scheduled corresponds to the total area of Inveruglas Isle. The area is irregular in shape and has maximum dimensions of 60m N-S and 55m transversely. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Arrochar and the County of Dumbarton as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

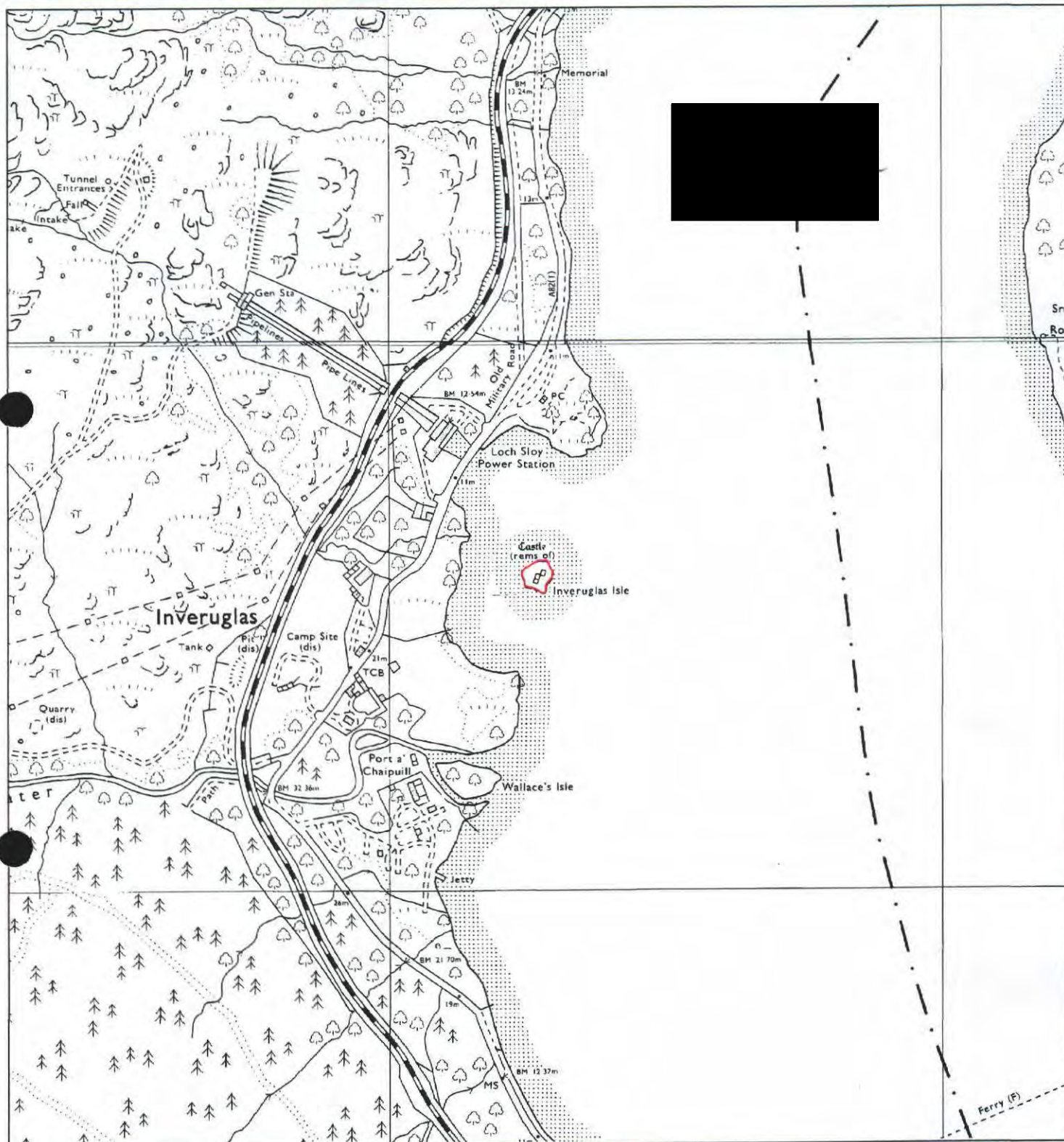
