The area to be scheduled comprises the remains described and an area around them within which related material may be expected to be found. It is circular, measuring 40m in diameter. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Arngask and the County of Perth as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

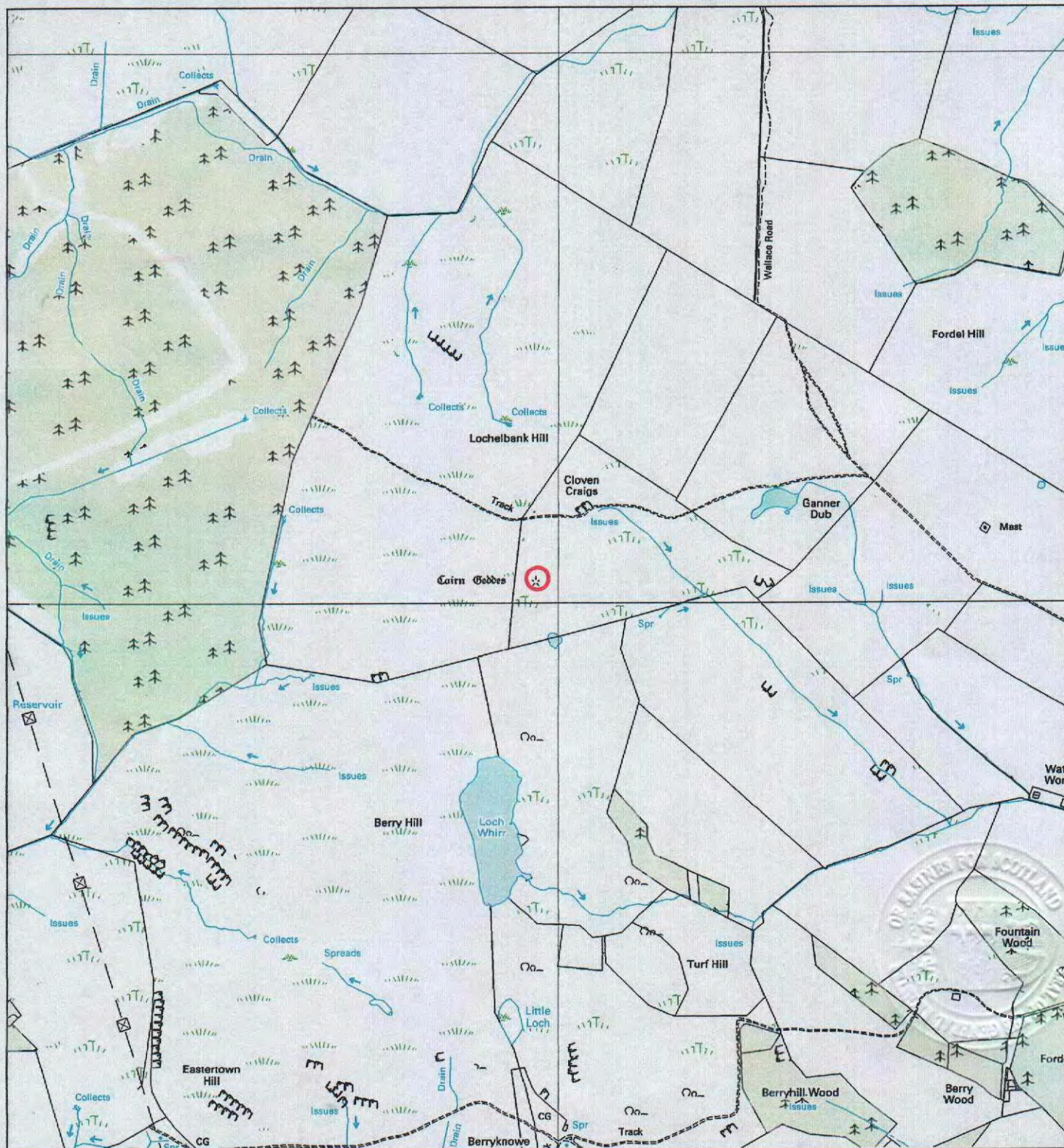
