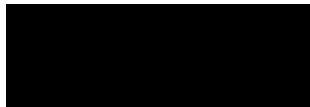

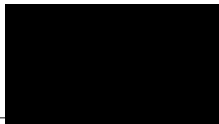
THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as North Queensferry, St James' Chapel comprises the remains of a medieval chapel dedicated to St James, extending along the northern edge of a walled churchyard. The west gable, which is pierced by a rectangular two-light window, survives to virtually full height, together with the lower portions of both the north and east walls; the north wall retains traces of a number of openings. Any residual burial rights are excluded from the scheduling. The area to be scheduled is irregular, following the line of the eighteenth-century wall around the burial ground, measuring a maximum of about 17.5m E-W by about 20m N-S. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Inverkeithing and the County of Fife as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto, is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

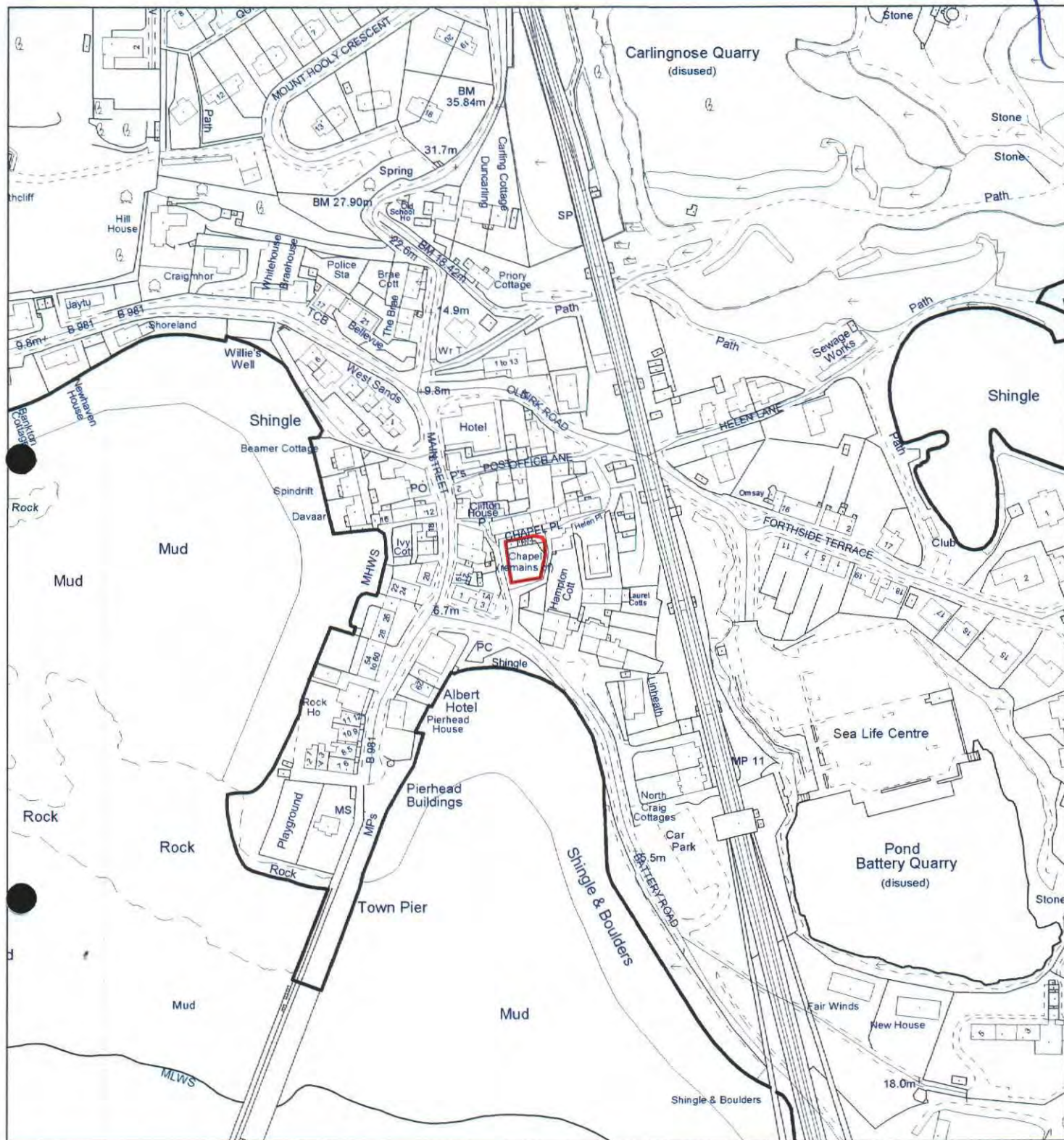
