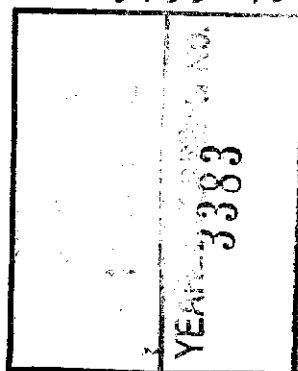

ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Bridge on Old Military Road over Allt Damh Burn comprises the remains of a small mid-18th century bridge, on the line of the Old Military Road connecting Coupar Angus to Fort George. The road was built to connect Perth and Dundee with the, then newly built Fort George. The small single-arched bridge over the Allt Damh Burn is typical of bridge building associated with the military roads. The bridge is in a ruinous condition, with only the N half of the single arch surviving. The arch has a span of 6.1m and the bridge stands 2.4m high. The level of the approach is much higher to the SE, where the roadway rises up a grass-covered ramp to cross the bridge. The original roadway was about 3.3m wide. The area to be scheduled is rectangular and includes the bridge and an area around it in which traces of activities associated with the construction and use of the monument may survive. The area has maximum dimensions of 12m NW-SE by 2.75m transversely. The roadway, which is still used as an estate road, now bypasses the bridge. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Strathdon and the County of Aberdeen as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

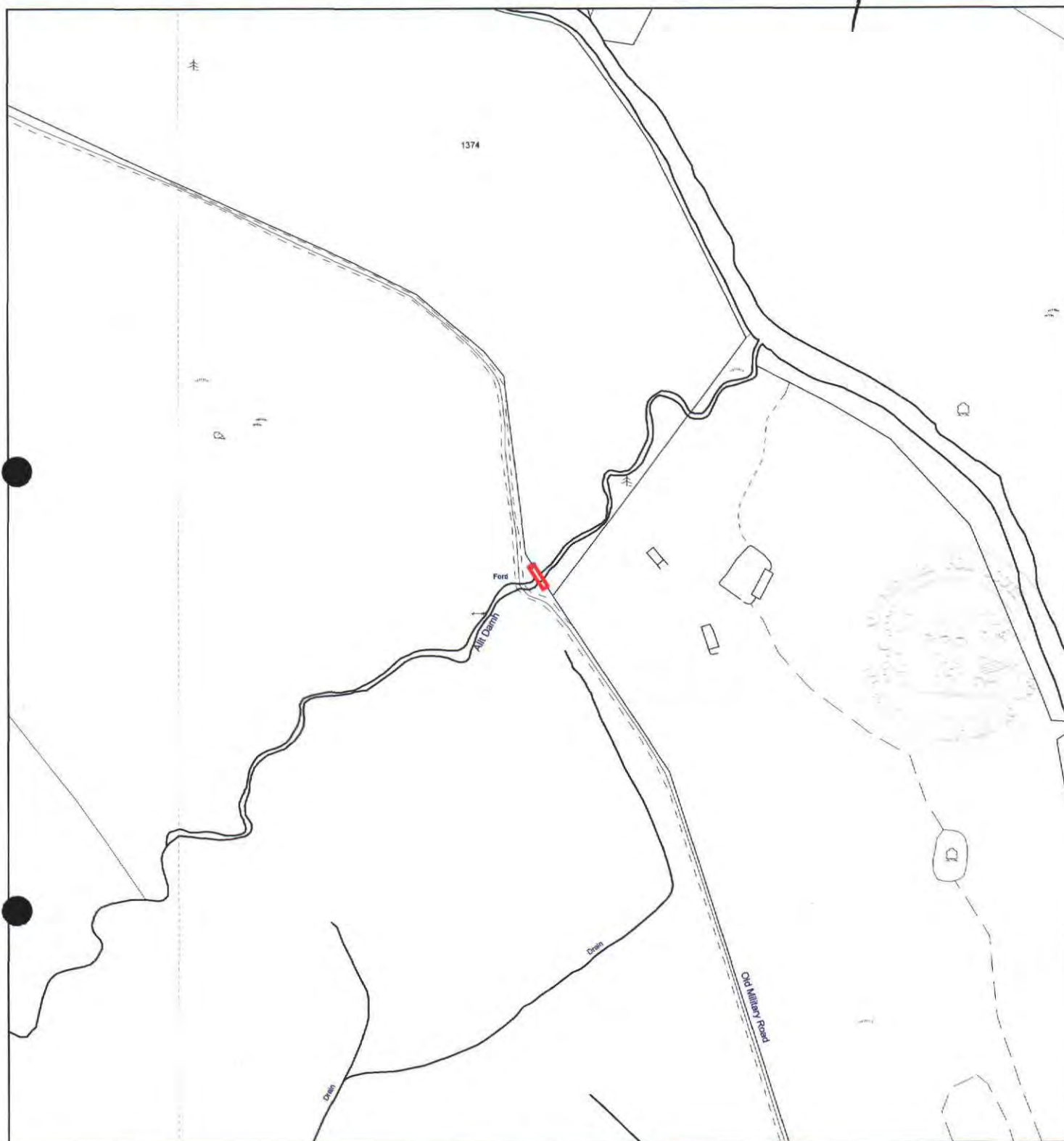
