ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Aberdeenshire Canal, remains of, Station Road, Woodside, Aberdeen comprises the remains of a section of the Aberdeenshire Canal and a bridge, visible as an earthwork and an upstanding structure respectively. This well-preserved section of the (now drained) Aberdeenshire Canal lies in a grass-covered playing field on the N side of Great Northern Road, Woodside, in the City of Aberdeen. The area to be scheduled comprises the remains described. It is irregular in shape with maximum dimensions of 140m WNW-ESE by 30m transversely. It is demarcated at the W end by the steps leading down to the modern houses and Station House; and at the E end by Deer Road. The scheduling excludes the road surface over the bridge and the gate in the E face of the bridge, to allow for routine maintenance. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Aberdeen and the County of Aberdeen as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and

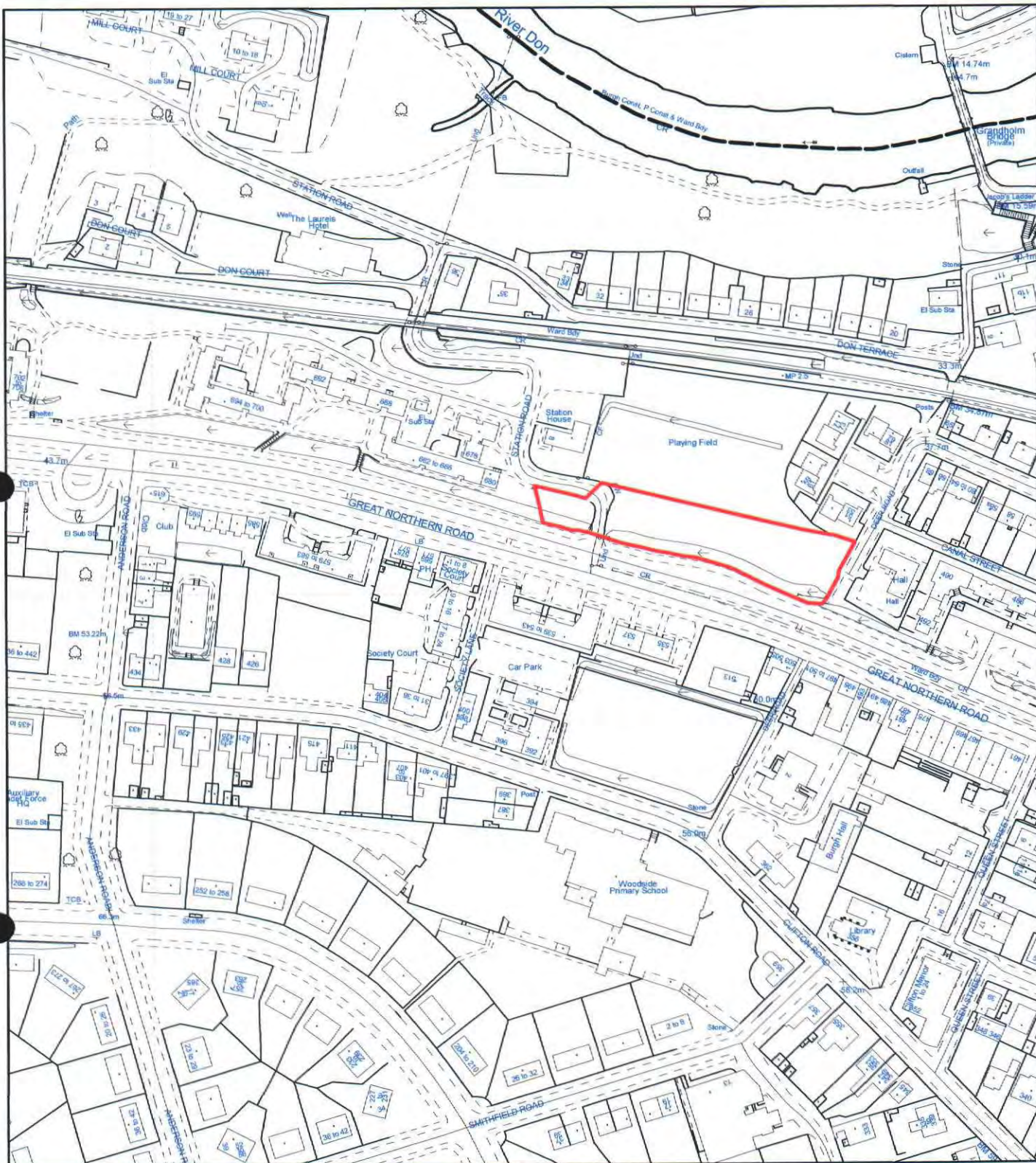

 Station Road, Woodside, Aberdeen

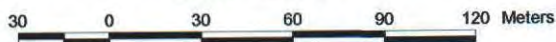
Aberdeen Parish
