ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Boarhills, pill boxes 1250m NW of, comprises a pair of well-camouflaged inter-linked Second World War pill boxes set into a rock promontory overlooking the foreshore, facing north-eastwards out to sea. The area to be scheduled is irregular, with maximum dimensions of 105m from SSW to NNE, and 80m from NNW to SSE. It includes the pillboxes themselves, an area of the rock above and behind them into which the pillboxes were intended to merge, and an area of rough ground in front of them where there would have been barbed wire entanglements amongst the scrub. The monument, which lies in the Parish of St Andrews and the County of Fife as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of
