The monument known as Rattray Line, pill box 585m SE of Rattray House, comprises the remains of a well-preserved pill box situated behind a dune system stretching from Rattray Head lighthouse shore station to the south, part of a larger defensive anti-tank stop line of 14 intervisible pill boxes and associated defences erected during World War II to protect against landings on the beach south of Rattray Head. The area to be scheduled is limited to the pillbox and a small zone around the outer surface of the walls. It is circular, with a diameter of 9m. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Crimond and the County of Aberdeen as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.
