The monument known as Mains of Cults, pill box 600m NW of, comprises a pill box, built as a response to the threat of German invasion in 1940 or 1941. It stands at the corner of the public road covering a road bridge crossing the main Aberdeen-Inverness railway. The area to be scheduled is rectangular and measures 10m N-S and 9m E-W. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Kennethmont and the County of Aberdeen as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.
