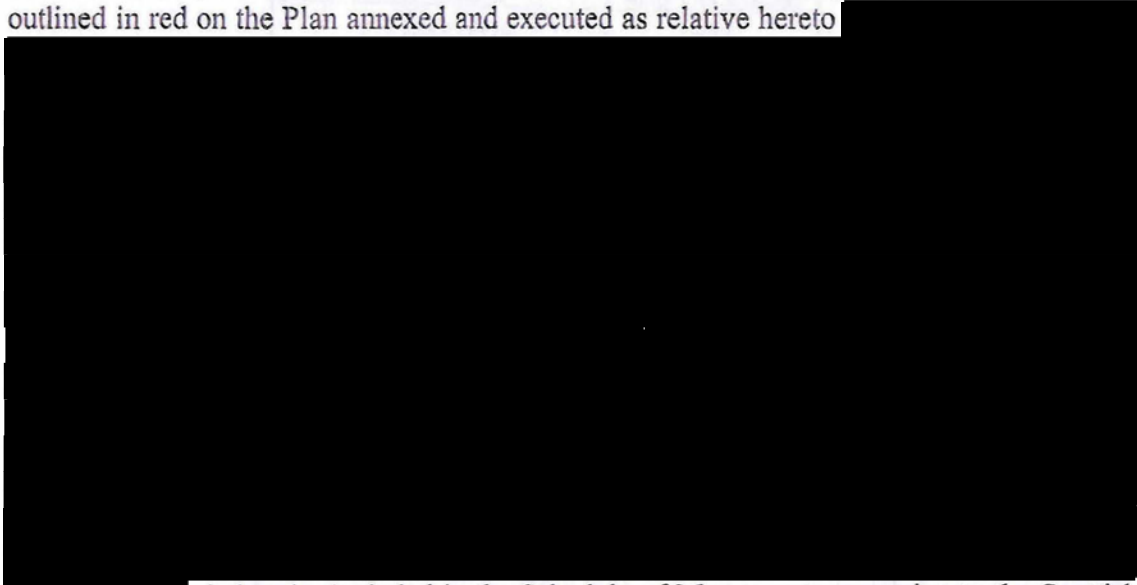


THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979

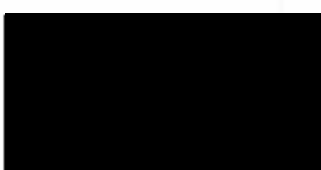
The monument known as Hill of Newleslie, hillfort, 400m N of Cotetown, comprises a defended hilltop enclosure of prehistoric date, visible as cropmarks on oblique aerial photographs and as field remains. It is situated at the summit of the Hill of Newleslie, 270m above sea level, and lies 400m N of the farmstead of Cotetown. The area to be scheduled is an oval that includes the remains described and an area around them within which evidence related to their construction and use may be found. Any part of the existing above-ground fencing is excluded from scheduling. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Leslie and the County of Aberdeen as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

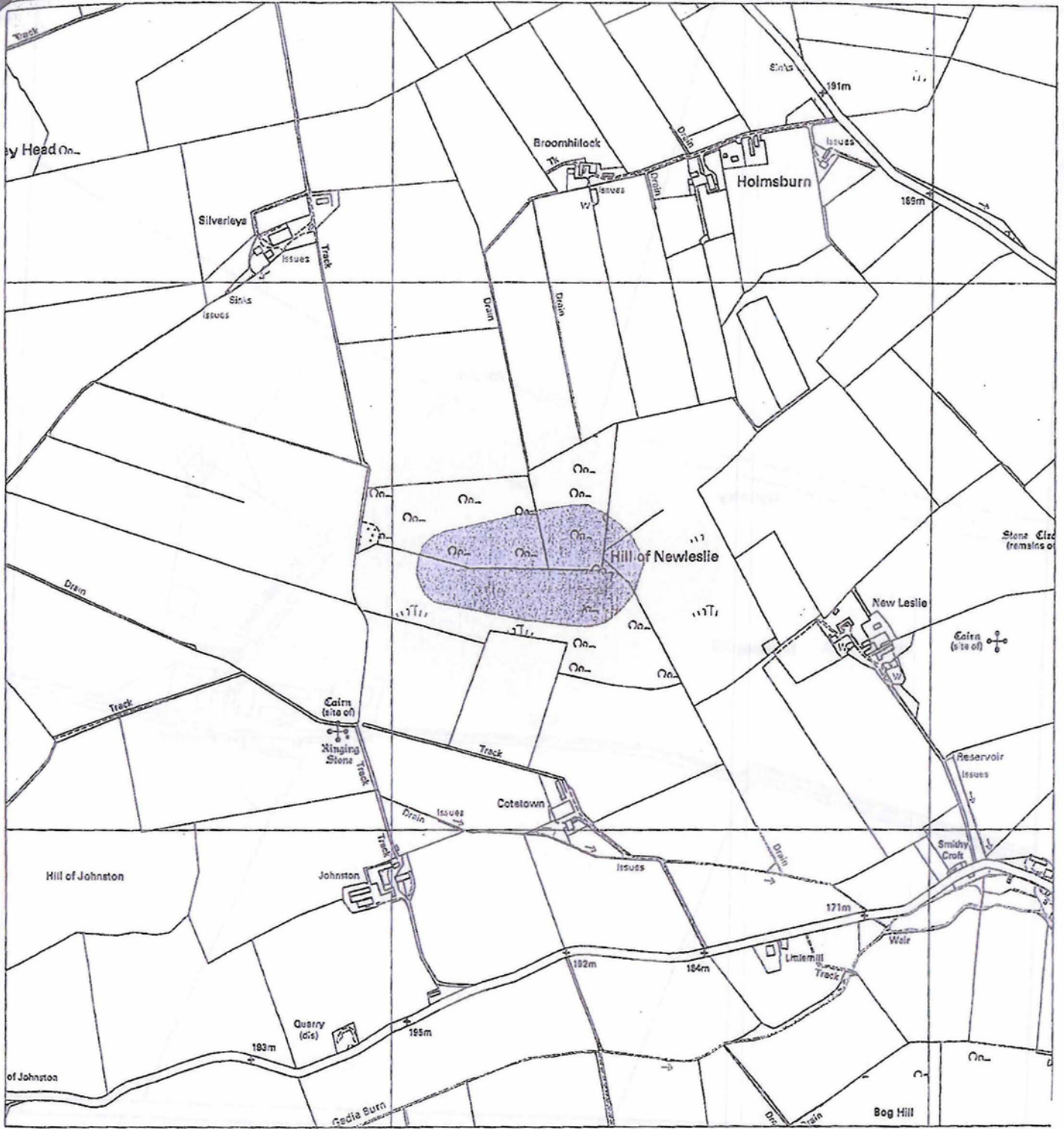

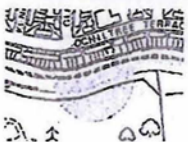

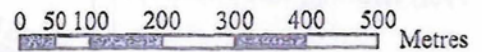
