



THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Knock Hill, cairn 530m SE of Corblelack, comprises the remains of a prehistoric burial cairn and is situated on a broad ridge, within a group of prehistoric burial cairns, hut circles and relic field systems identified on Knock Hill. The partially turf-covered monument is situated in an area of rough grazing, just to the N of a curving field bank. The cairn has a 5.3m diameter surrounding kerb which includes boulders up to 0.7m across. The area to be scheduled is circular, centred on the cairn, to include the visible remains and an area around in which evidence relating to its construction and use may survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Logie-Coldstone and the County of Aberdeen as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

 hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.
