

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 12125  
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Standingstones, hut circles 615m and 680m SW of comprises the remains of two hut circles and a single associated clearance cairn, likely to be Late Bronze Age or Iron Age in date. They are visible as two interrupted roughly circular rings of turf-covered loose stone and a low, circular turf-covered mound. The hut circle and clearance cairn are 125m to the W of the lone hut circle and all three occupy the summit and N flank of a low SW-facing slope, at 130m above sea level. The W hut circle is situated on level ground and is now overgrown by grass. It appears to display two phases of construction. The earlier phase is 11m in diameter, within a stony bank up to 2.5m in thickness and 0.3m in height. The entrance to this structure is in the east. It measures 2m in width and is flanked by expanded wall terminals up to 3m in thickness and 0.5m in height. The second construction phase of this structure is represented by an oval depression in the centre of the circle's interior. It measures 8.8m NW-SE by 7.3m transversely and has a depth of 0.2m. The cairn is located 10m to the NE of the hut circle. The second hut circle is located 125m to the ESE, sited on the summit of a low rise. It measures 9.2m diameter within a grass-grown stony bank up to 3m in thickness and 0.5m in height. The entrance on the east, measures 1.2m in width. The area to be scheduled comprises two separate areas, rectangular and circular, to include the remains described and an area around within which evidence relating to their construction and use may survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Echt and the County of Aberdeen as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

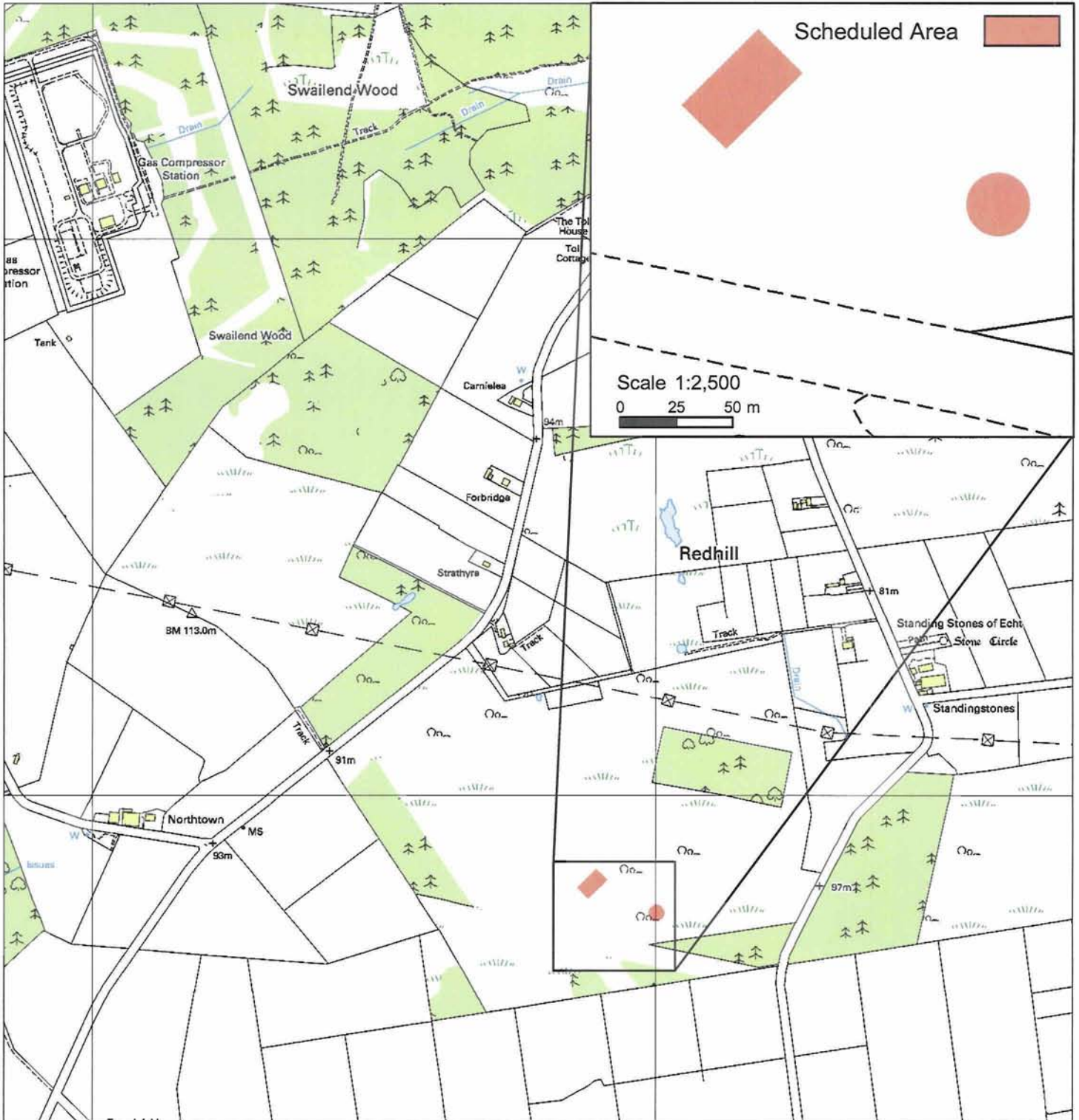
