

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 12471
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Ellem Church, church and burial ground comprises the former parish church of Ellem and an associated burial ground surrounding the structure. It survives as the largely turf-covered footprint and lower courses of a ruined building surrounded by uneven ground that contains a number of burials and burial markers. The church occupies the crest of a small hill that overlooks the Whiteadder Water at a height of 175m above sea level. The area to be scheduled is irregular on plan, to include the remains described and an area around within which associated remains may be expected to be found. Specifically excluded are the above-ground elements of the post-and-wire fence to the north and the wooden fence to the east, to allow for their maintenance. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Cranshaws and the County of Berwick as shown in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

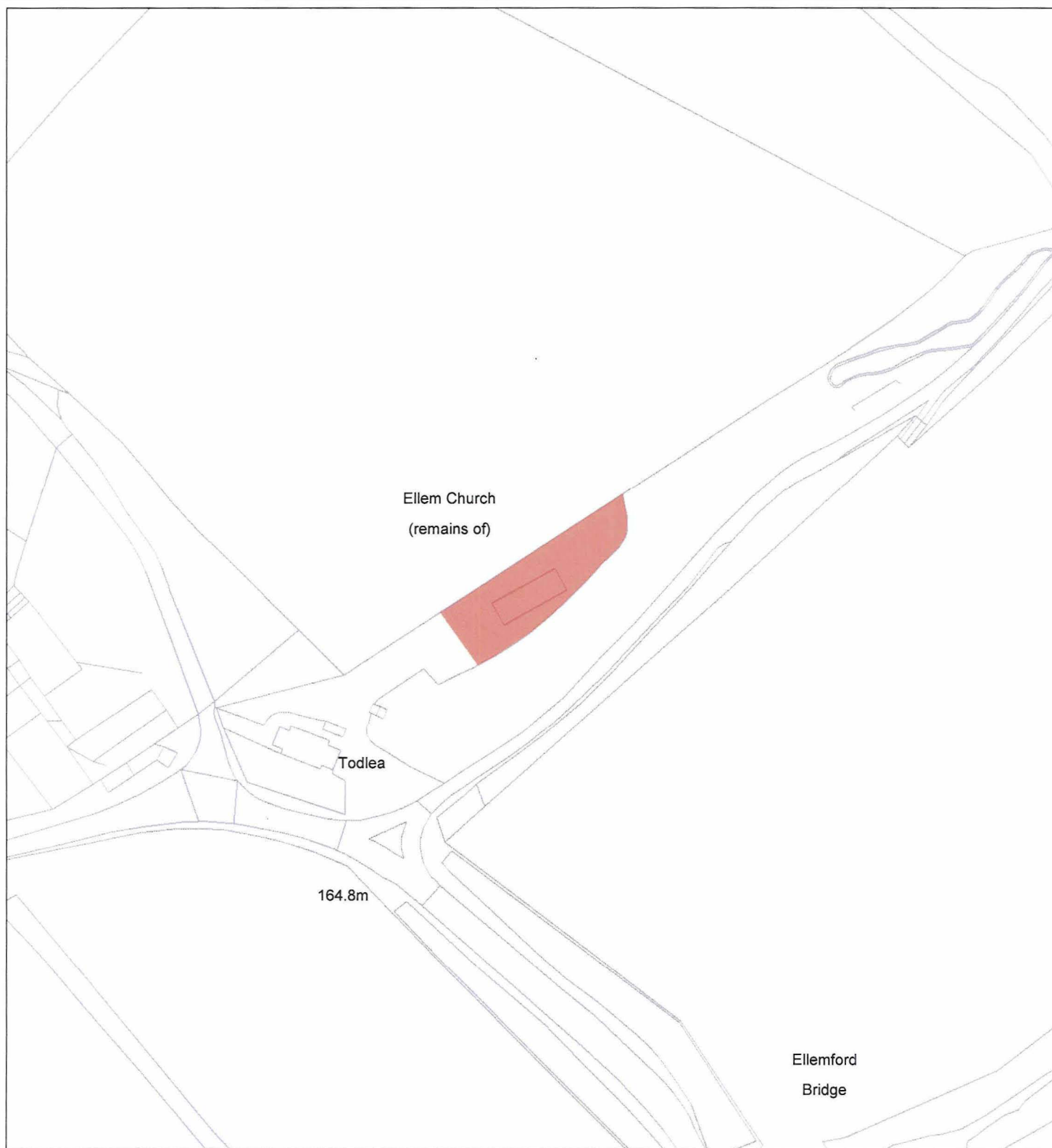
