

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 12617  
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Wauchope Castle, castle and manse 235m SSW of Springhill comprises the remains of a medieval motte-and-bailey castle, a later stone castle and a 17th-century manse. The monument is located at around 90m above sea level on the W side of a gorge, through which runs the Wauchope Water. The area to be scheduled is irregular on plan to include the visible remains of the monument, as well as an area around it within which evidence relating to its construction and use may survive. The scheduled area runs up to but excludes the post-and-wire fence on either side of the road. To allow for their maintenance, the scheduling excludes the above-ground elements of all other fences and telegraph poles. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Langholm and the County of Dumfries as shown in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

[REDACTED], is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

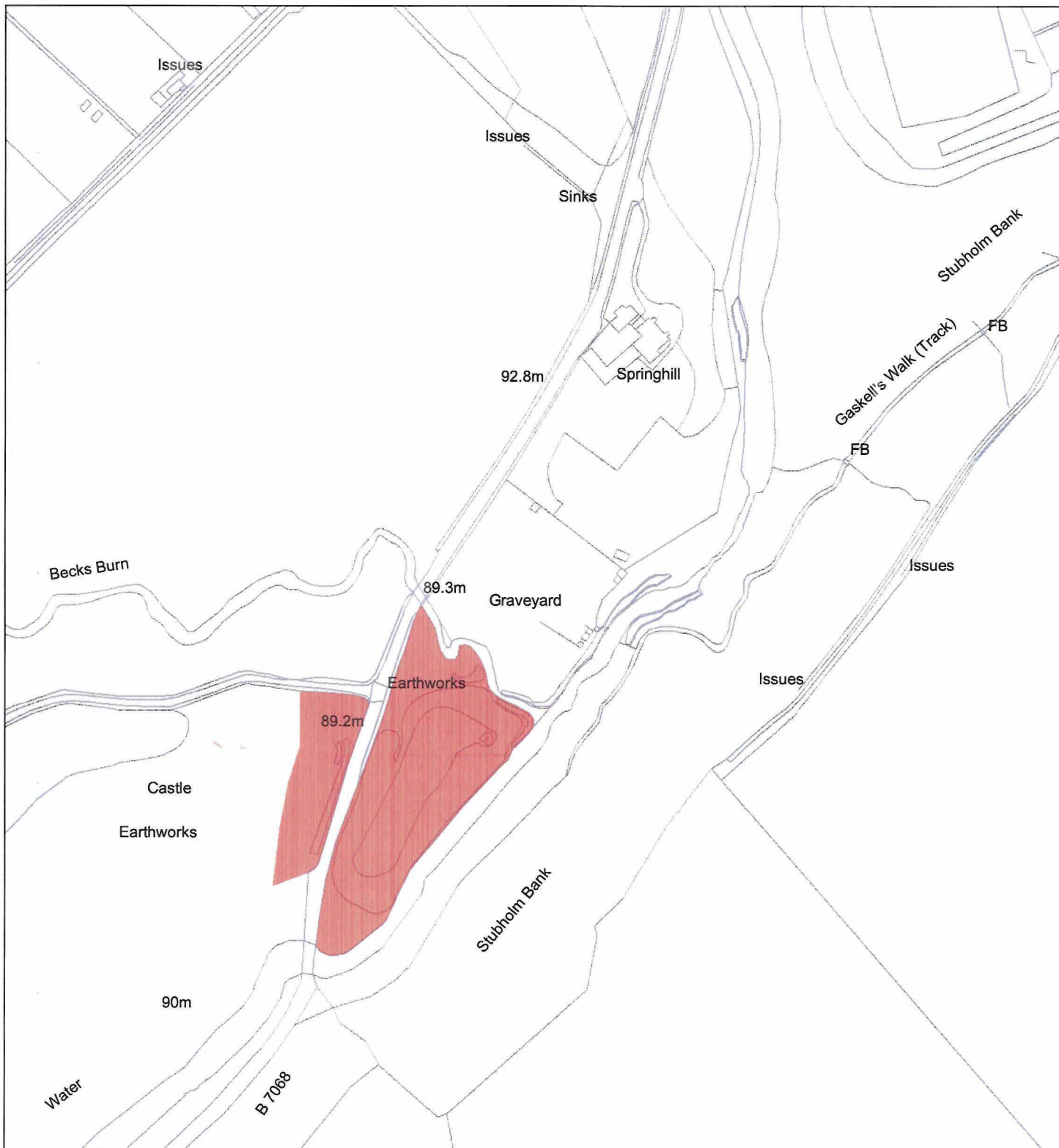
