

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 12765
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Doune Castle comprises Doune Castle, its defences and earthworks. It is situated south-east of Doune village, around 20m above sea level, at the neck of a promontory between the River Teith on the west and Ardoch Burn on the east. The area to be scheduled is irregular on plan, to include the remains described above and an area around them within which evidence relating to the monument's construction, use and abandonment may survive. The scheduled area extends up to but excludes the driveway and road that leads to the sewage works south of the castle, the boundary wall on the NW side and the path to the west. To allow for their maintenance, the scheduling also excludes the top 50cm of the path to the north that leads to the castle entrance and the above-ground elements of all garden furniture, sculptures and waymarkers. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Kilmadock and the County of Perth as shown in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto [REDACTED]

[REDACTED], is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

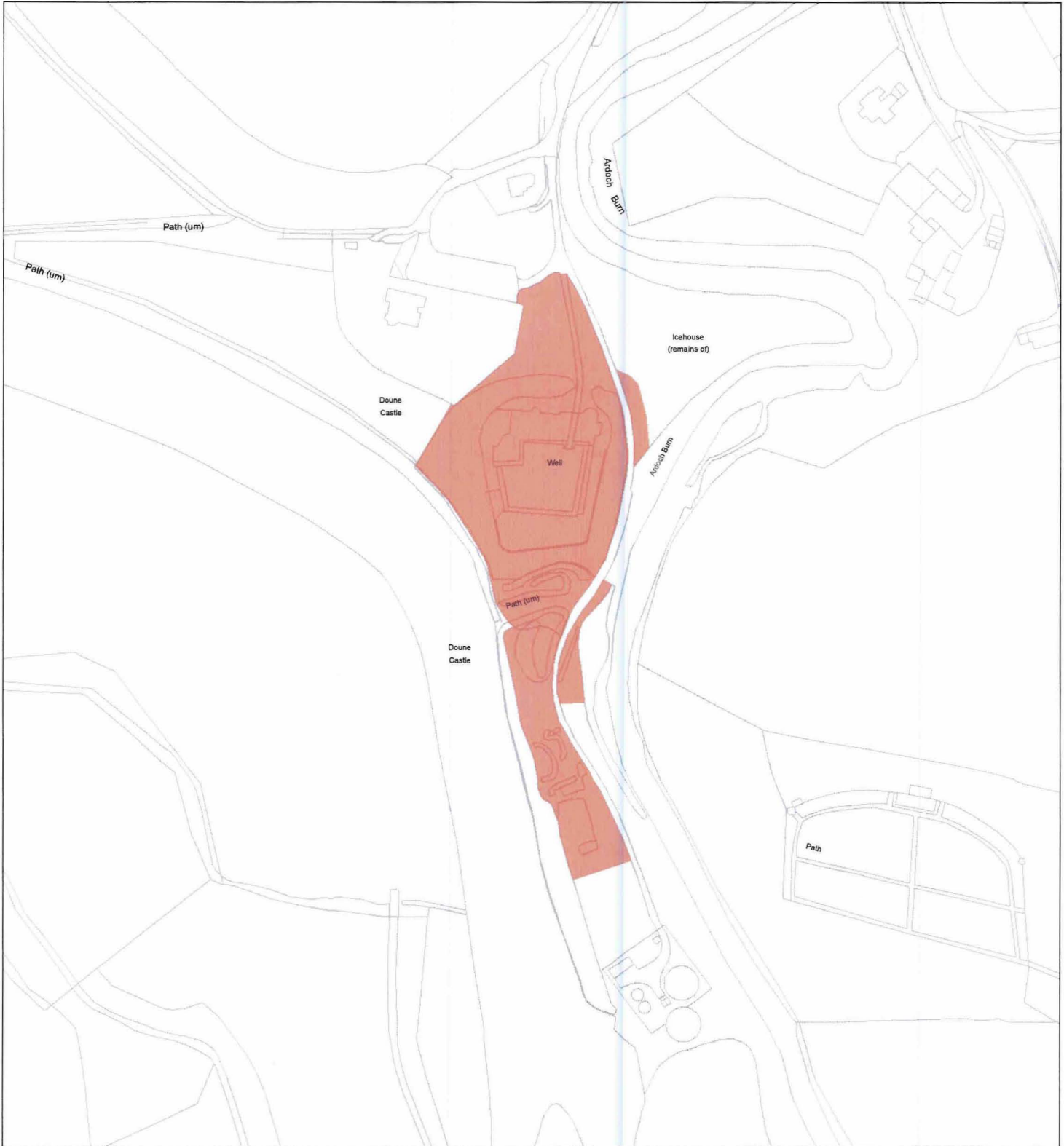
