

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 12954
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Cairn na Burgh Castle, Cairn na Burgh More & Cairn na Burgh Beg comprises Cairn na Burgh Castle, which occupied the two adjacent islands of Cairn na Burgh More and Cairn na Burgh Beg, situated in the Treshnish Isles archipelago. The monument comprises substantial curtain walls on both islands, dating probably to the 15th or 16th century. On Cairn na Burgh More, the curtain wall enclosed an area of at least 1.36 hectares or the majority of the southern part of the island. Standing within the curtain wall on Cairn na Burgh More is a 15th- or 16th-century chapel and an 18th-century barracks, guardhouse and associated buildings, all relating to the occupation of the island after the 1715 Jacobite uprising. The area to be scheduled is irregular on plan, to include the remains described above and an area around them within which evidence relating to the monument's construction, use and abandonment may survive. The above ground elements of the Ordnance Survey trig point and the navigation light are specifically excluded from the scheduling to allow for their maintenance. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Kilninian and Kilmore and the County of Argyll as shown in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto [REDACTED]

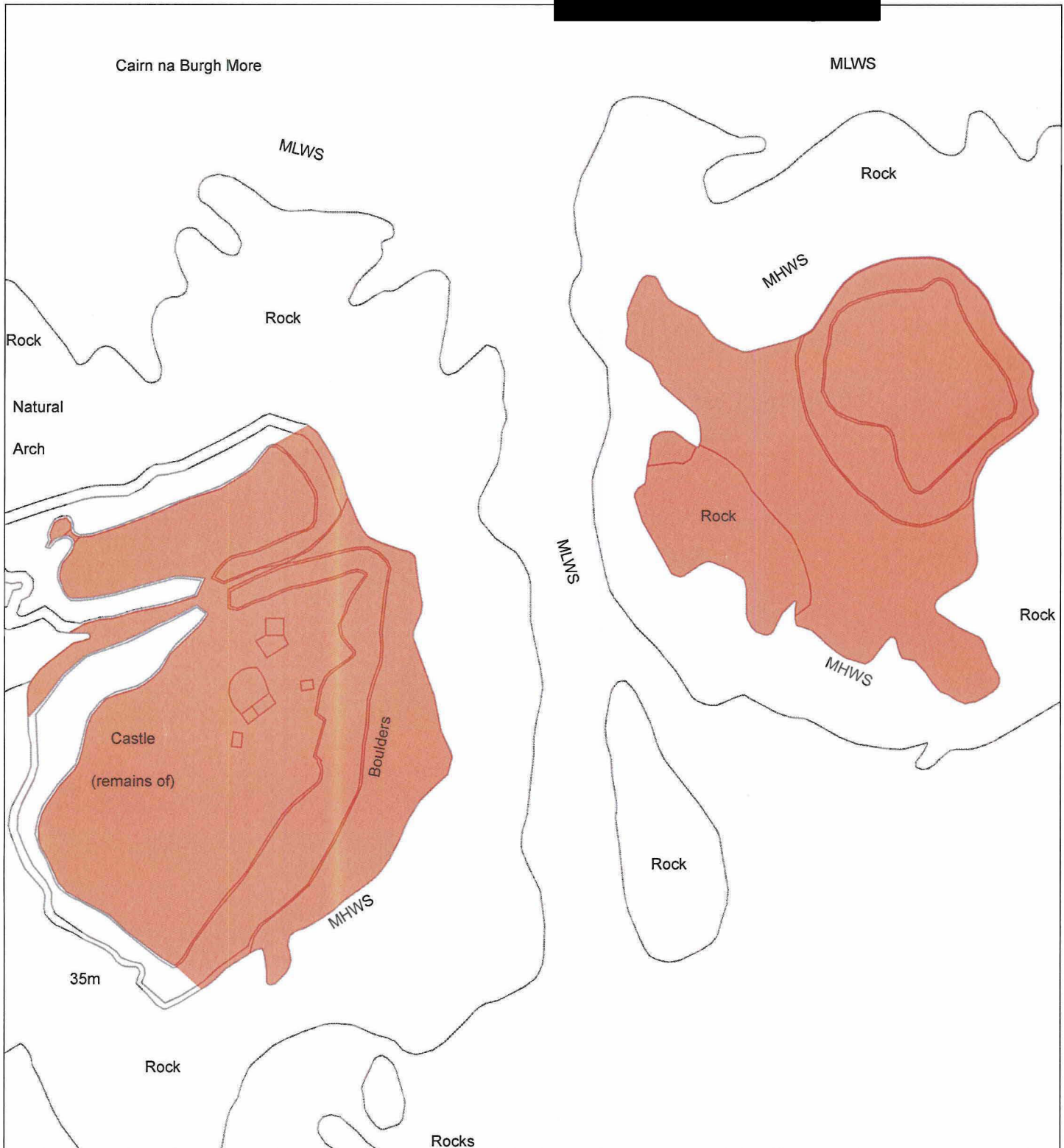
