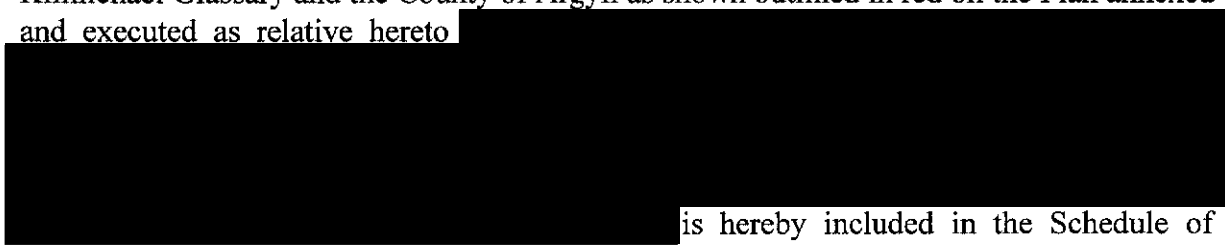

ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Ach nabreck, prehistoric rock carvings 370m NNE of comprises two groups of prehistoric rock carvings which are situated on rising ground to the N of Ach nabreck farmhouse. There are two areas to be scheduled: the W area is polygonal on plan and measures 90m from NE to SW by up to 30m; the E area is rectangular on plan and measures 20m from E to W by 10m, to include the visible rock carvings and an area around in which associated remains may survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Kilmichael Glassary and the County of Argyll as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto



is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

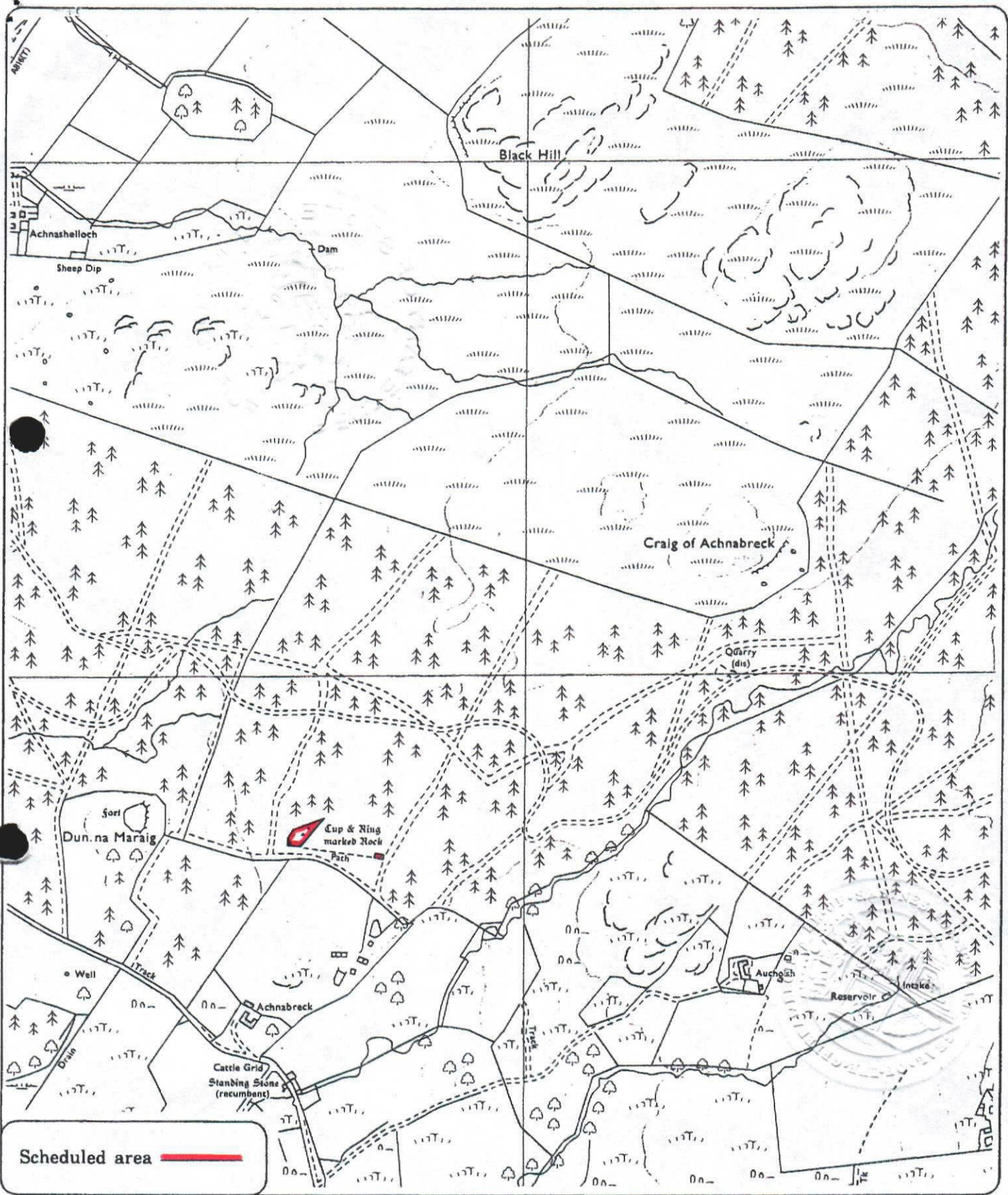

Scheduled area

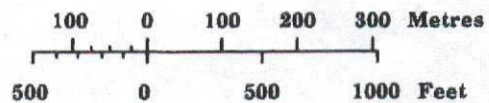
