ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Antonine Wall, camp, fortlet, fort and settlement, Croy Hill comprises a section of the Antonine Wall which runs across Croy Hill. The area to be scheduled measures a maximum of 1620m WSW-ENE by 210m NW-SE, to include a length of the Antonine Wall, the Roman fortlet, fort, camp, bathhouse, part of the civilian settlement and the field system. The south-western boundary is marked by the gate forming the entrance to the Guardianship area, and the eastern boundary by a field fence 60m E of the point where the wall line is crossed by an old railway, now used as a track. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Cumbernauld and the County of Dumbarton as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

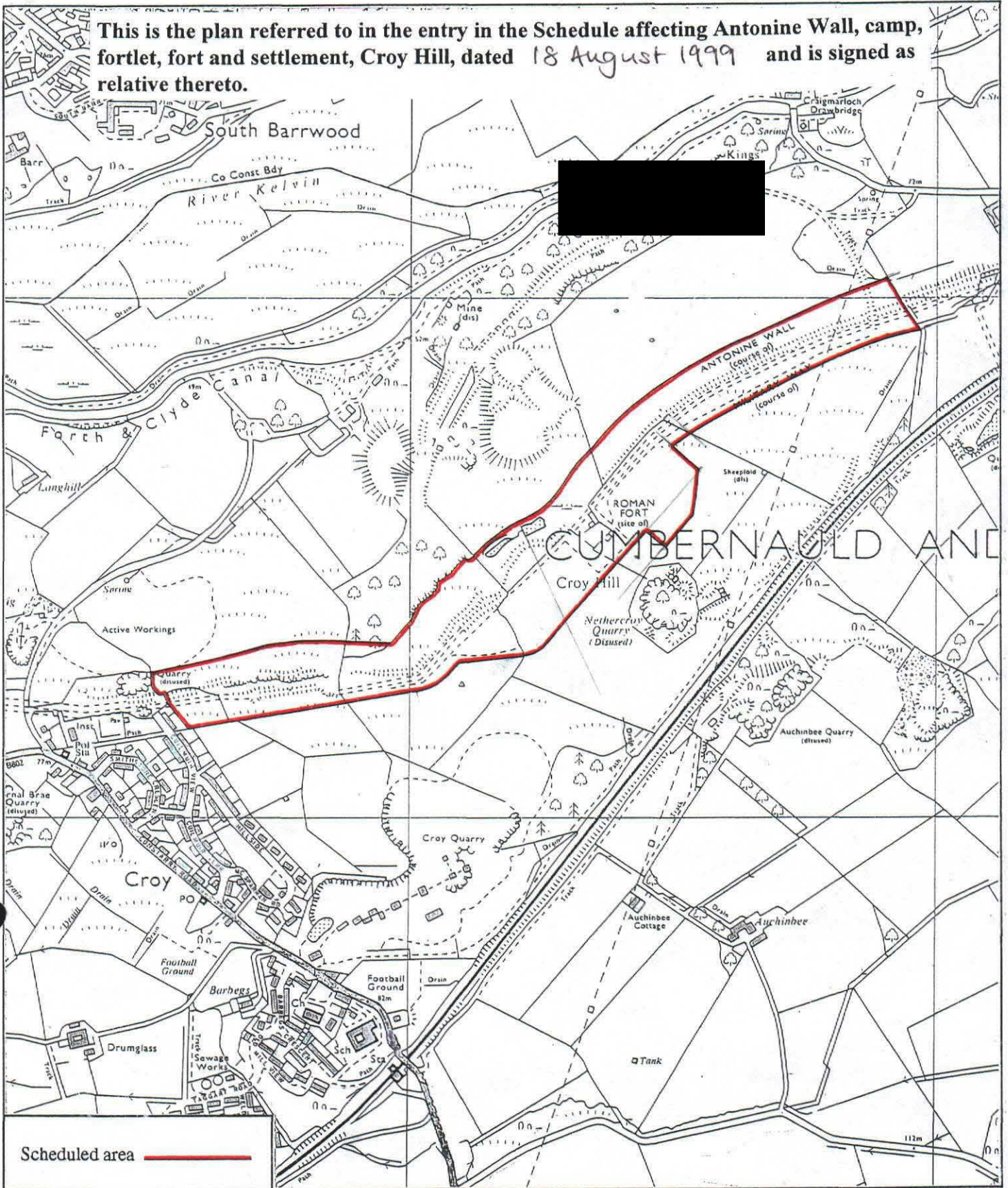

Scheduled area

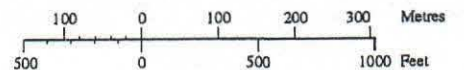
Antonine Wall, camp, fortlet,
