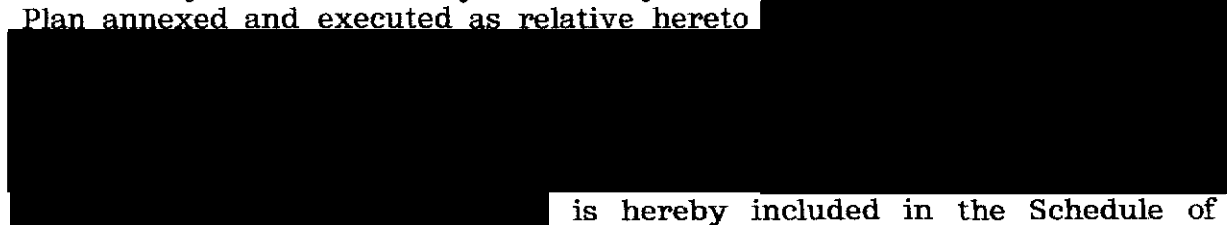

The monument known as Earl's Palace, Birsay comprises a ruined palace. The area to be scheduled includes the remains of the palace contained within an area of ground defined by the edge of the public road on the N, W and S, and by a wall and fence line on the E, measuring overall 70m N-S by 40m E-W. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Birsay and Harray and the County of Orkney as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto



is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

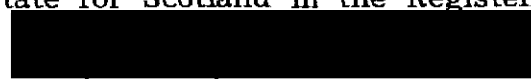

Scheduled area

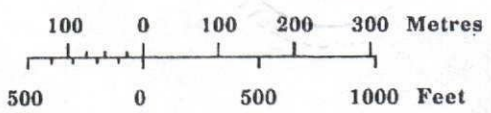
Earl's Palace, Birsay
