THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Brechin, Maison Dieu Chapel comprises the surviving fragment plus the remainder of the site of the chapel which served the Maison Dieu hospital in Brechin. The area to be scheduled is rectangular, 13m E-W by 10m N-S to include the surviving wall and an area to the N which may be expected to contain foundations or other traces of the chapel. That portion of the E wall of the chapel which forms part of the wall of the house adjacent is excluded. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Brechin and the County of Angus as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

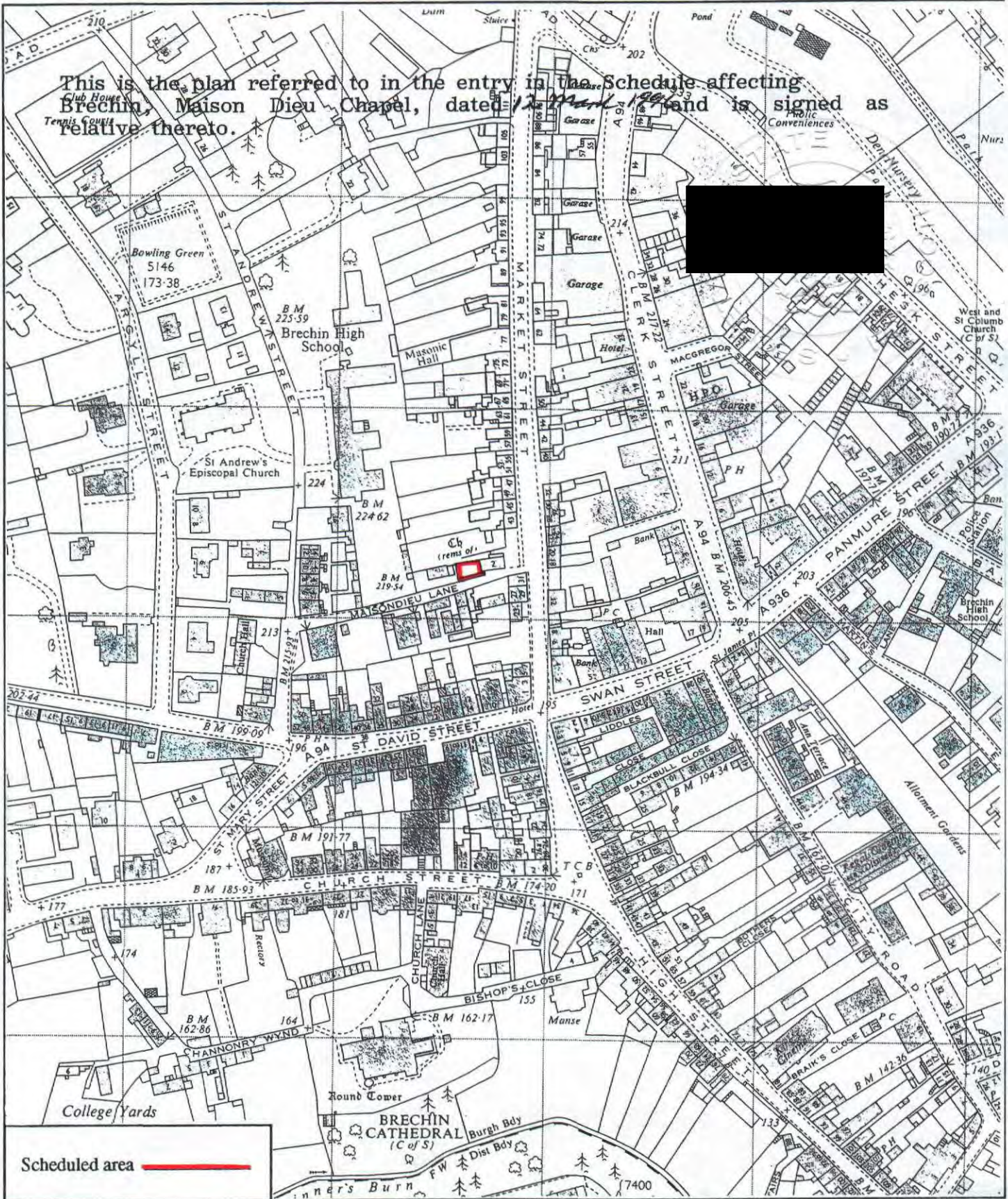

Scheduled area —

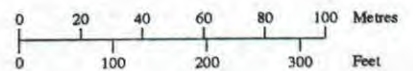
Brechin, Maison Dieu Chapel
