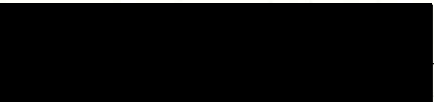


THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 90043
AMENDED ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The entry in the Schedule of monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the above Act in respect of the monument known as Broughty Castle, dated 2 March 1998 is hereby in accordance with the provisions of section 1(5) of the above Act amended to clarify the extent of the scheduled monument. The scheduled area includes the grassed area immediately around Broughty Castle, as shown in red on the plan annexed. However it does not include the extensive park across the road to the north which is also known as 'Castle Green'.

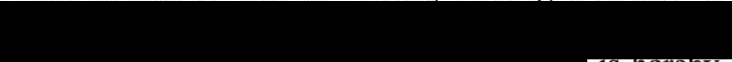

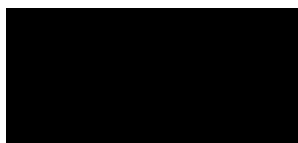

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Broughty Castle comprises a mid-Victorian stronghold. The area to be scheduled is irregular in plan with maximum dimensions of 110m N-S by 80m E-W to include the Castle and the area known as Castle Green. The boundary runs clockwise along the N perimeter of Castle Green and turns SE to run parallel to the building lying at the E side of the Green before turning SW to follow the perimeter wall of the Castle. The boundary follows this wall to its W-most point before turning NE to meet the starting point. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Dundee and the County of Angus as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed 

 is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

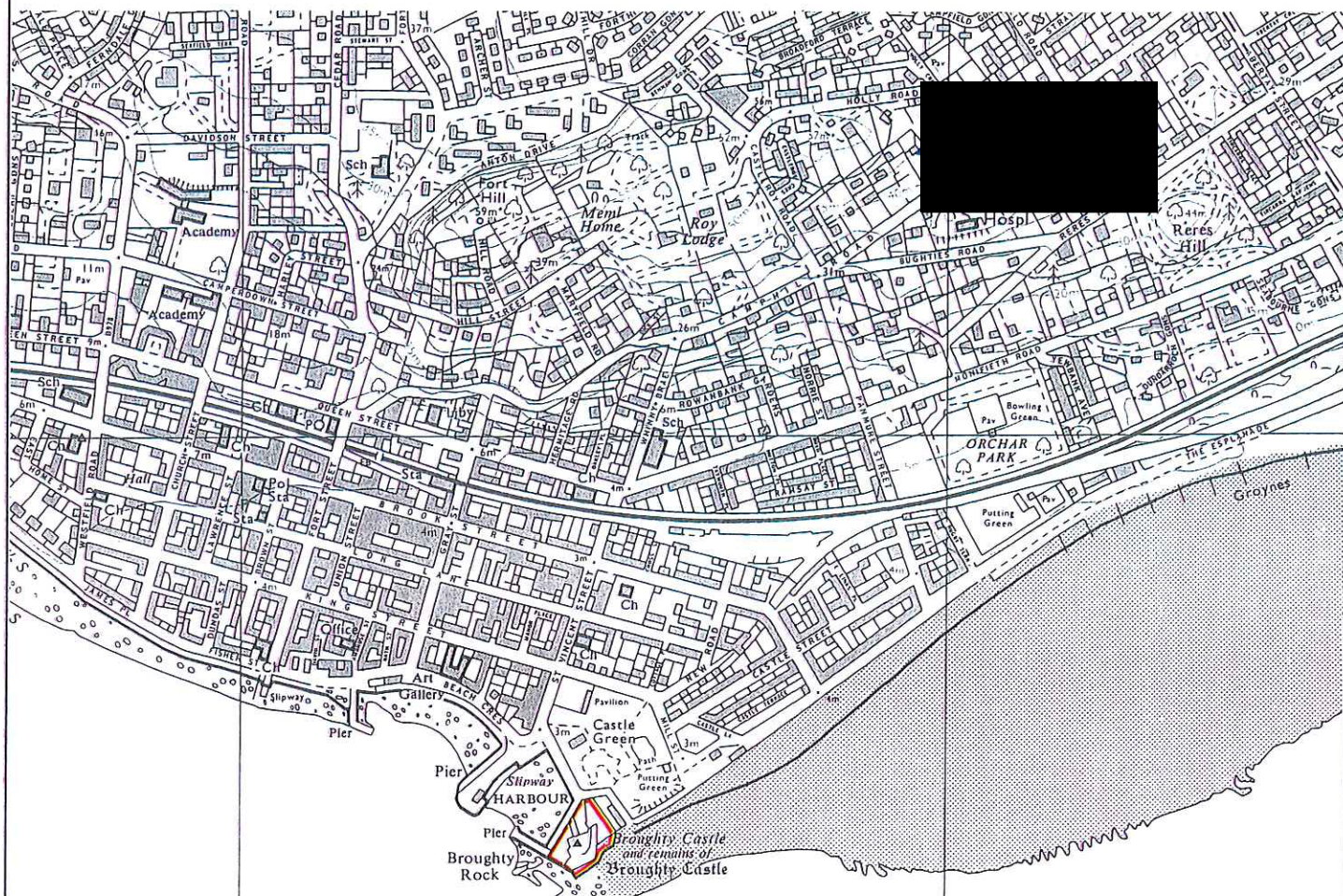
