the owner of the Monument known as Castle of Old Wick or "Old Man of Wick" (in ruins) situated on a promontory immediately to the south of Castle Goe and to the north of the inlet from the sea known as Lord Oliphant's Leap at the east or seaward end of the boundary line enclosing the Municipal and Police Burgh of Wick on the south, the westmost point of said Castle being 90 yards east-south-east of the Mill Lade running north to the Fulteney Distillery, Wick, at its nearest point and 240 yards north-east of Castlepark, being the subjects indicated in red colour on the annexed plan and being part of the property known as Brough Croft on Hempriggs Estate situated in the Parish of Wick and County of Caithness.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 6 of the Ancient Monuments Act, 1931, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Works and Public Buildings hereby give you notice that it is their intention to include the Monument above specified in a list of monuments to be published by them under Section 12 of the Ancient Monuments Consolidation and Amendment Act, 1913.
