The monument known as Culsh, souterrain comprises a souterrain, an underground storage chamber of the Iron Age, situated immediately to the north of the Culsh farm steading on the edge of the A974 road. The area to be scheduled measures 20m WNW to ESE by 20m transversely, bounded on the north side by the main road and on the south side by the farm buildings (which are specifically excluded from the scheduling). The monument, which lies in the Parish of Tarland and the County of Aberdeen as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto [REDACTED]

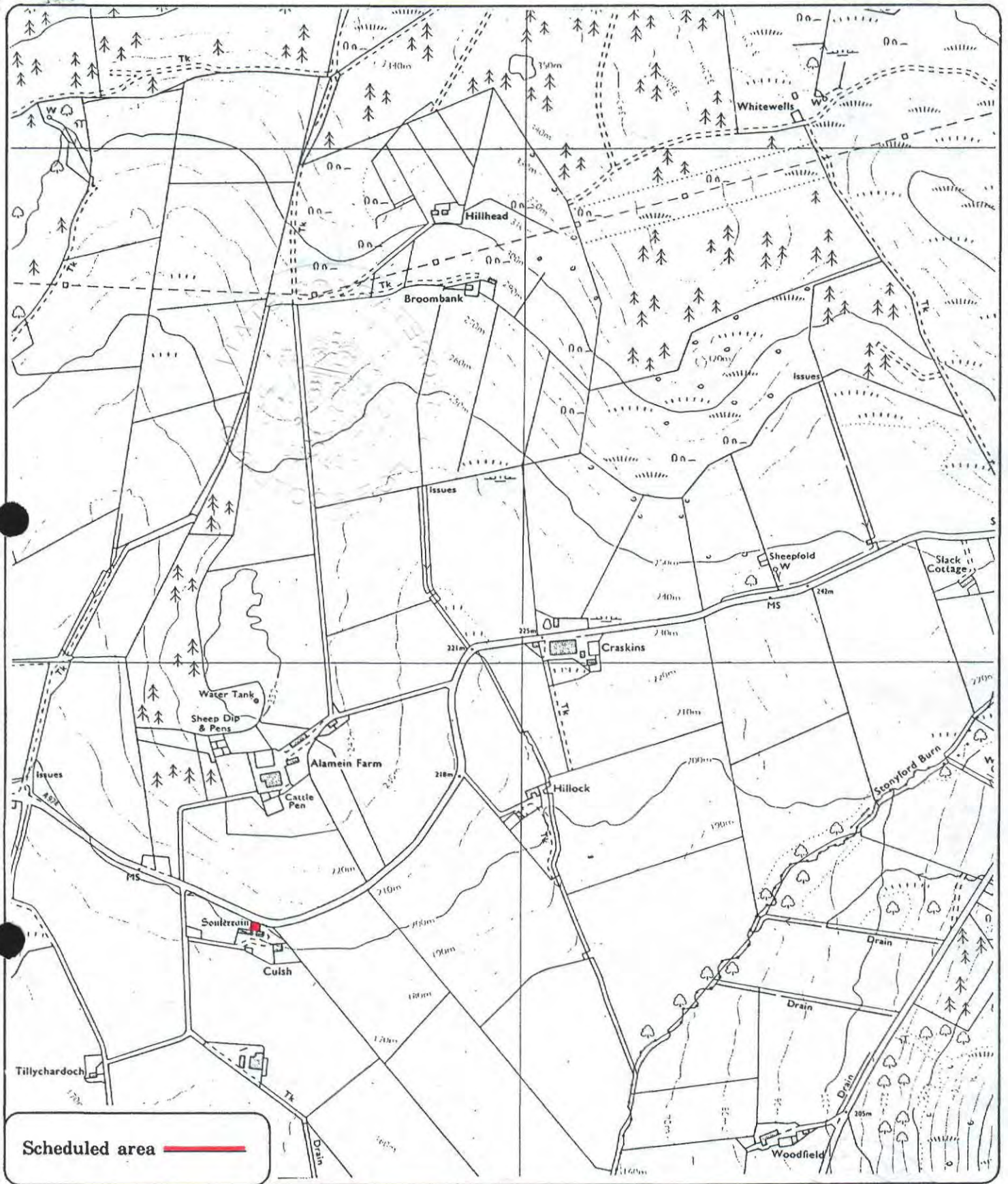

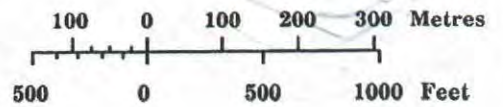
