

ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Dun Carloway, broch comprises a later prehistoric broch which is situated in common grazings on a prominent knoll. The area to be scheduled is a circle 30m in diameter centred on the centre of the broch, to include the broch and an area around in which evidence relating to its construction and use may survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Uig and the County of Ross and Cromarty as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

 is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.
