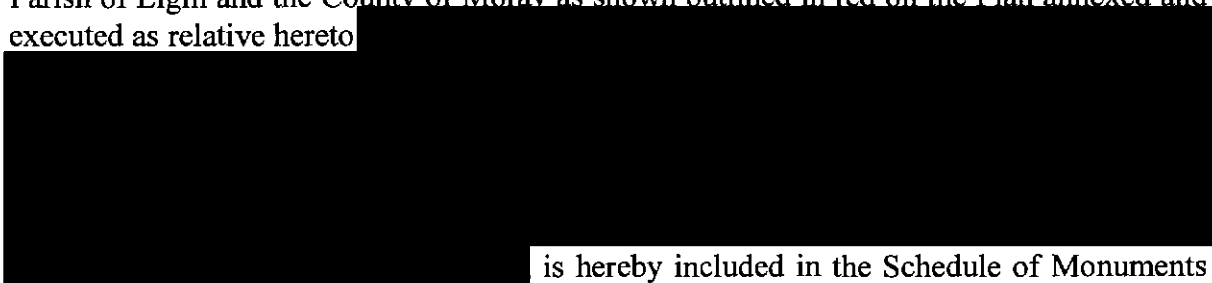

ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Bishop's House, Elgin comprises the remains of Bishop's House, which stand some 50m NW of the W door of Elgin cathedral, on the west side of King Street. The area to be scheduled includes the standing structure of Bishop's House, and an area of ground the boundaries of which measure 10.67m on the E (running S from the surviving SE corner of the building along the east face of the boundary wall (fence), 15.1m on the S, 21.2m on the W, and 12.2m on the N (extending W from the surviving NW corner of the building along the N face of the boundary wall). The monument, which lies in the Parish of Elgin and the County of Moray as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto



is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section I(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.
