THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Haddington, St Martin's Kirk comprises the substantial remains of the 12th century church of St Martin. The area to be scheduled is defined to the E and W by the low boundary walls approximately 10m out from the E and W ends of the nave. To the N and S the area extends 10m out from the wall of the building. The area measures approximately 40m ENE-WSW by 30m transversely. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Haddington and the County of East Lothian as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto [REDACTED]

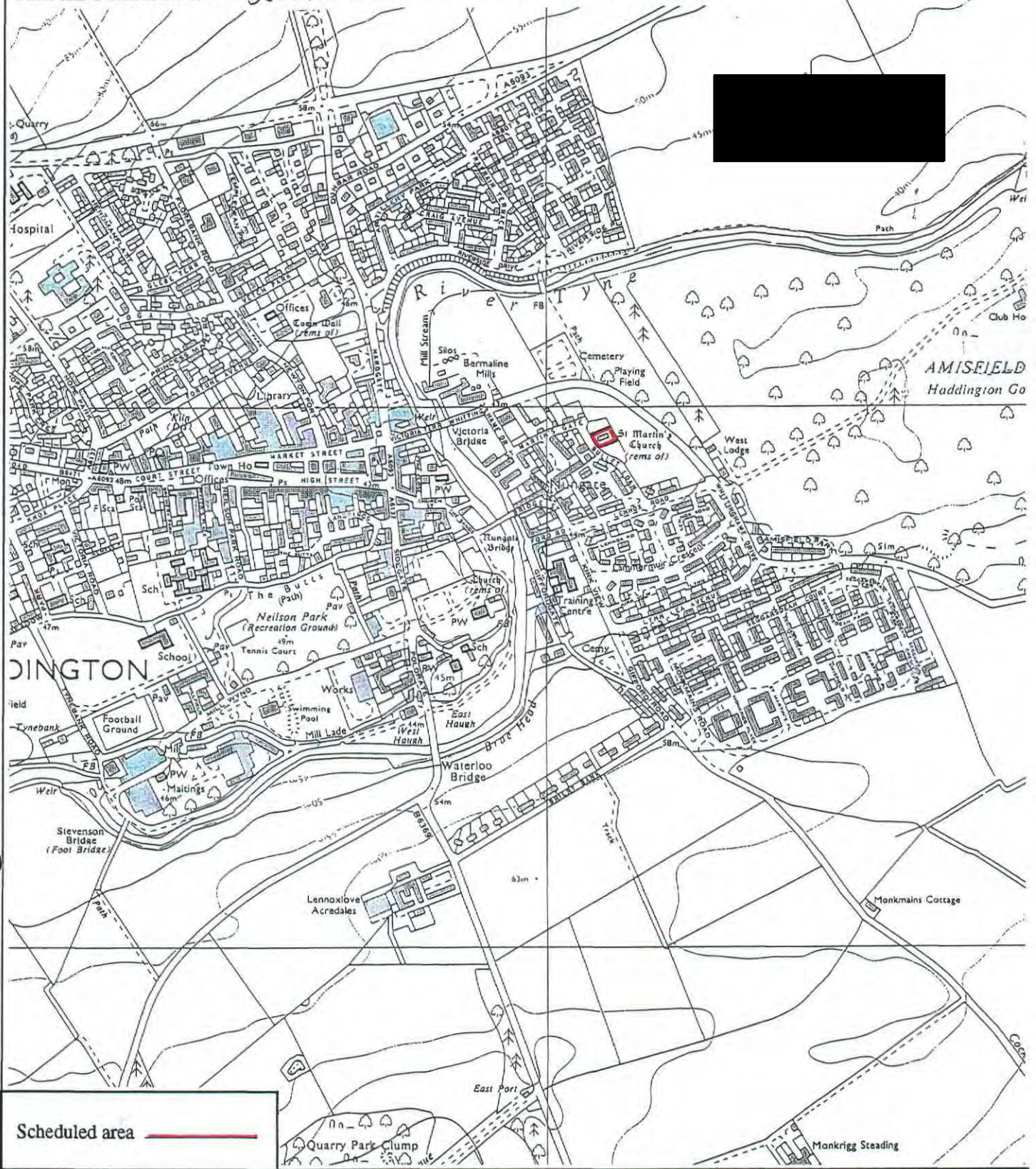

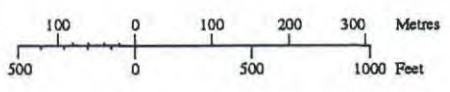
Haddington, St Martin's Kirk
