



THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 90198
AMENDED ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The entry in the Schedule of monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the above Act in respect of the monument known as **Knowe of Yarso, chambered cairn**, is hereby in accordance with the provisions of section 1(5) of the above Act amended to clarify the dimensions of the scheduled area by deleting the sentence 'It measures 27m NW-SE by 19m' and replacing it with the sentence 'It measures 25.5m NW-SE by 13m' and to specifically exclude the boundary fence and above ground elements of an interpretation board from the scheduling.

ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Knowe of Yarso, chambered cairn comprises a Neolithic chambered burial cairn which is known to have been in use around 2900 BC. It is situated at 105m above sea-level on a hillside ledge. The area to be scheduled is rectangular and is contained within the fence surrounding the monument. It measures 27m NW-SE by 19m. The boundary fence and concrete roof are included. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Rousay and the County of Orkney as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

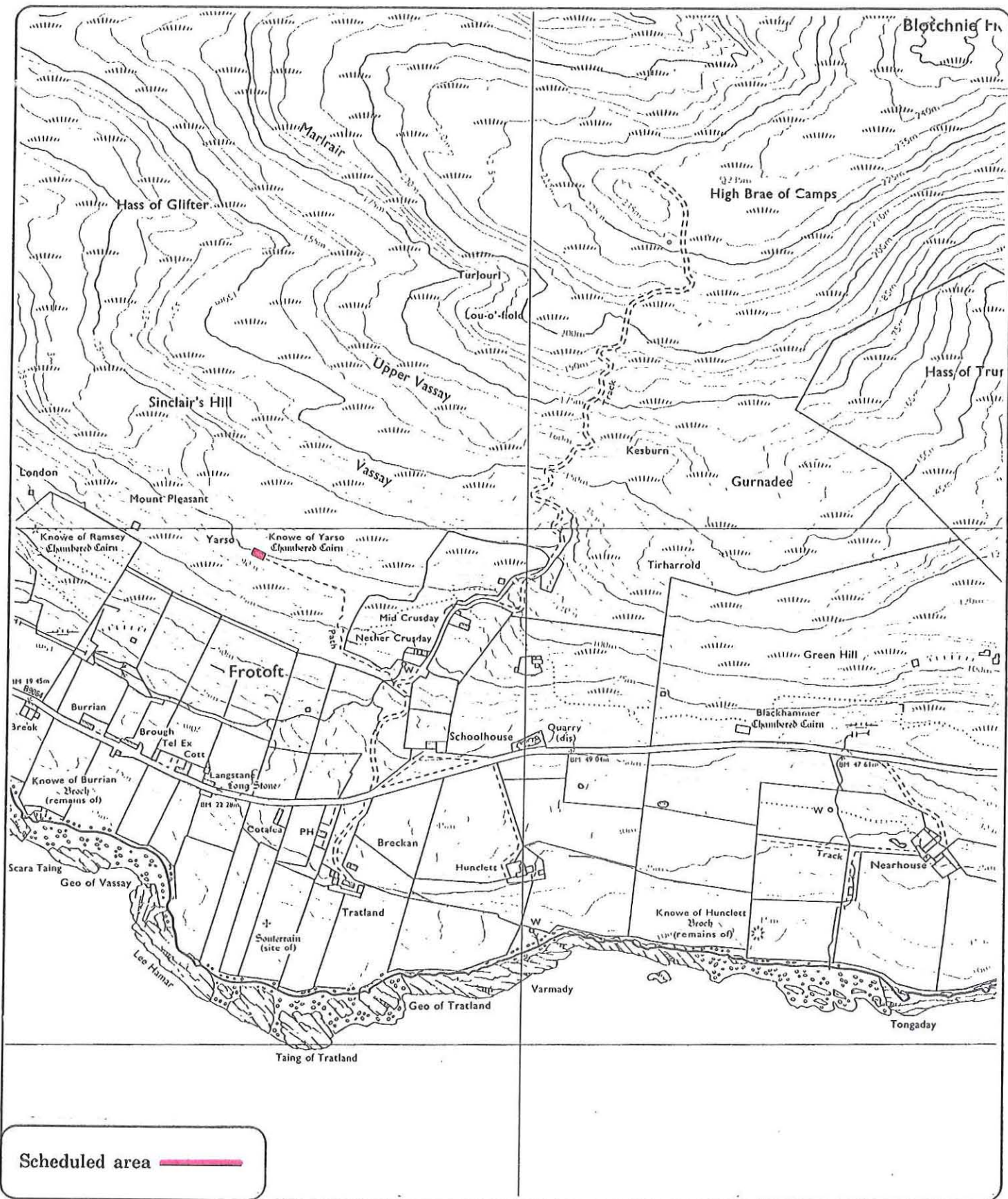

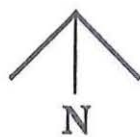

Scheduled area

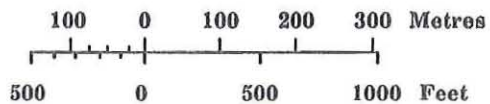
Knowe of Yarso, chambered cairn
