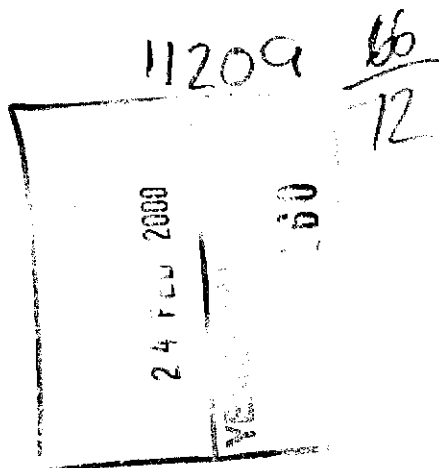

ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Laggangarn, standing stones comprises two standing stones of prehistoric date measuring 1.88m and 1.58m in height respectively, and standing about 1m apart. The area to be scheduled comprises the remains and an area around them within which related material may be expected to be found. It is circular with a diameter of 30m. The monument, which lies in the Parish of New Luce and the County of Wigtown as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

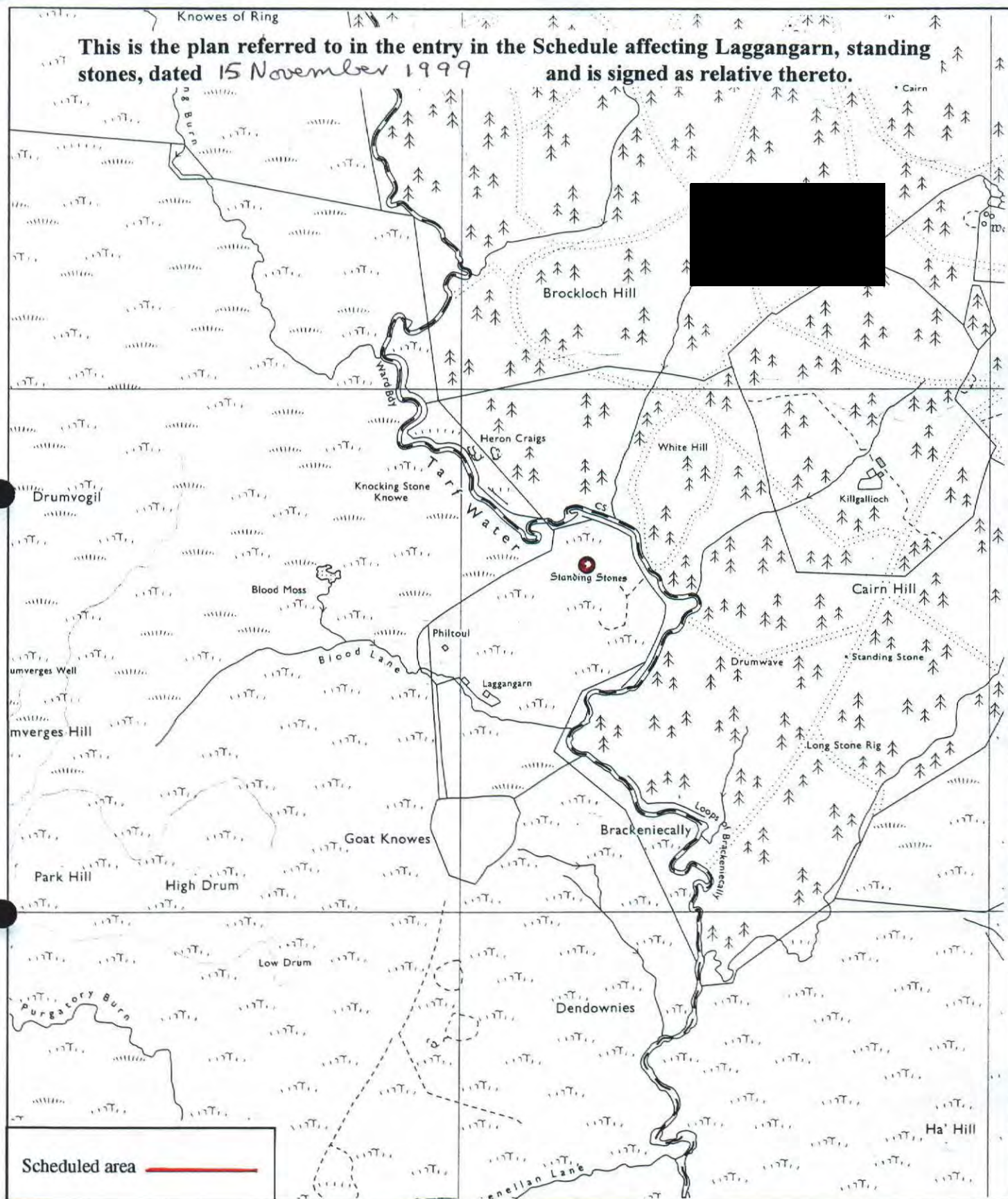

This is the plan referred to in the entry in the Schedule affecting Laggangarn, standing stones, dated 15 November 1999 and is signed as relative thereto.



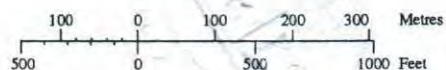
Laggangarn, standing stones
