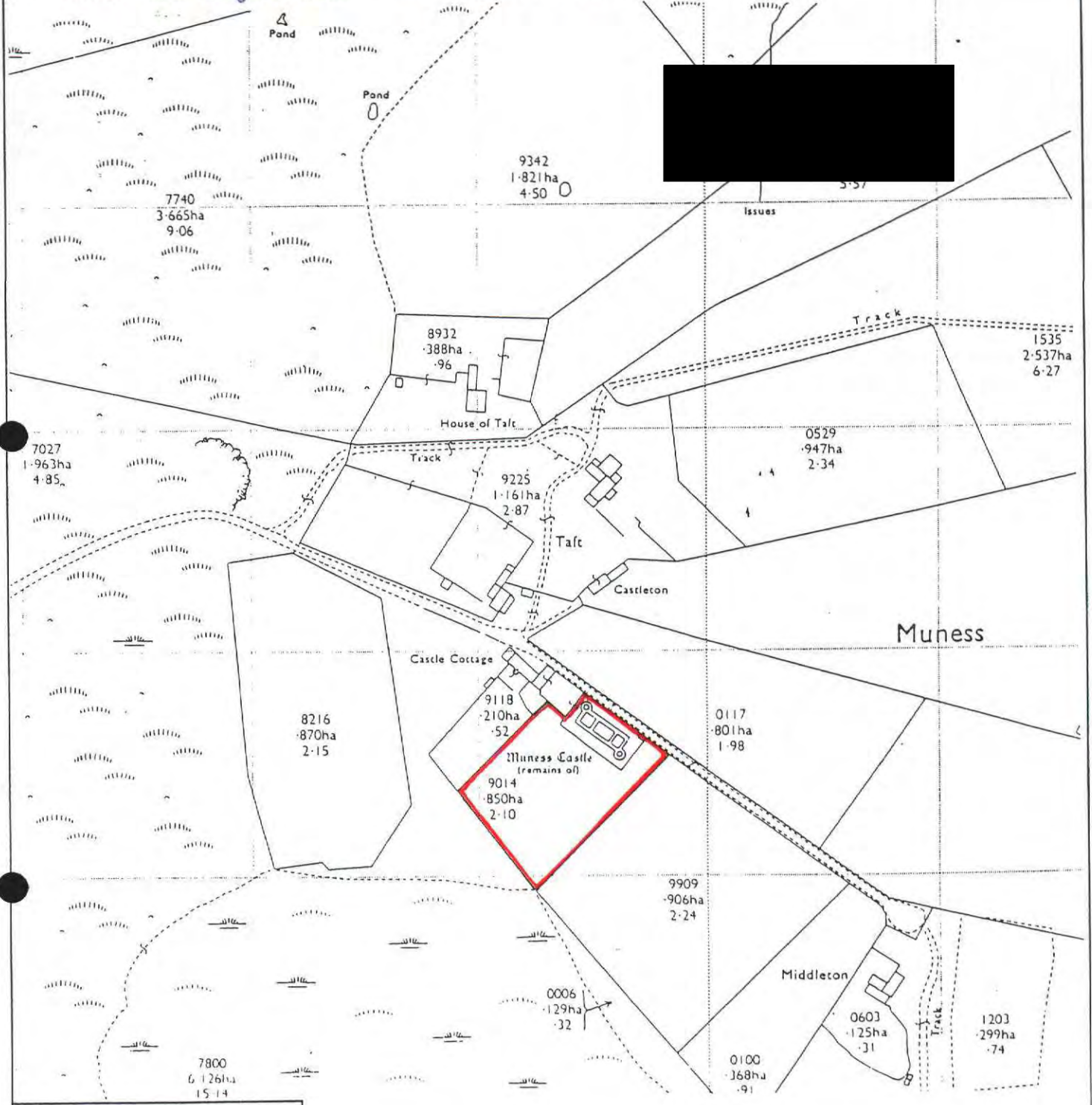
THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979  
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Muness Castle comprises a castle built at the end of the 16<sup>th</sup> century. The area to be scheduled comprises the remains described; the wall immediately surrounding the castle, and an area to the S and W within which related material may be expected to be found. It is irregular on plan, with maximum dimensions of 83m NE-SW by 55m NW-SE. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Unst and the County of Orkney and Zetland as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto, is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the [REDACTED] and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.



