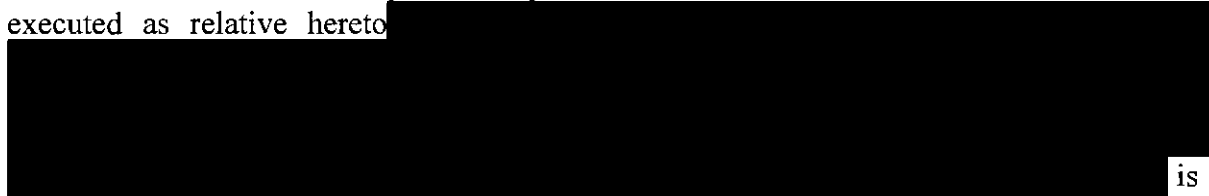

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Rennibister, souterrain comprises a souterrain and the ancient structures in an area immediately around it. The area to be scheduled is irregular in plan measuring a maximum of 25m N-S by 22m E-W. Its west side is in part defined by the outer edge of, but excludes, the wall of the farm buildings N of the farmhouse, and also excludes the modern surface of the farm road to a depth of 30cm or the top of the stonework of the souterrain, whichever is the lesser. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Firth and the County of Orkney as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto



is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

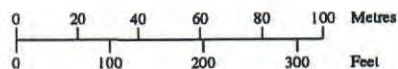
