ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

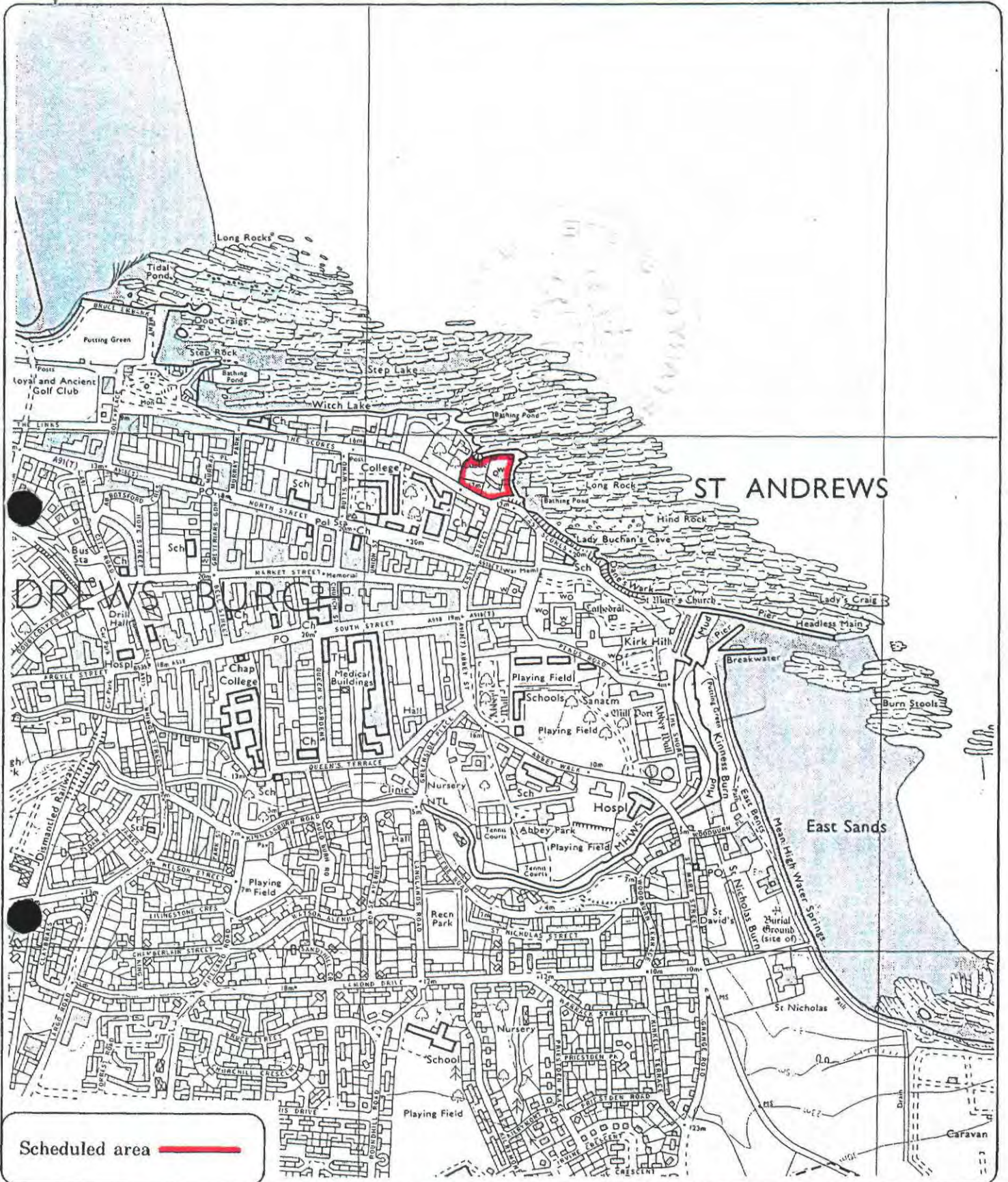
The monument known as St Andrews Castle comprises the surviving portions of St Andrews Castle and the areas likely to have been occupied by its outer courtyards. The area to be scheduled is defined by sea-cliffs to the N and E, by the boundary with Castlecliff House to the W, and by the boundary wall along the Scores to the S, and includes the remains of the Castle and the areas of its outer courtyards to the W and S. It measures a maximum of 120m WSW-ENE by 115m NW-SE. The monument, which lies in the Parish of St Andrews and the County of Fife as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the [redacted] compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.
