THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Wideford Hill, chambered cairn comprises a Neolithic chambered cairn situated on a steep W-facing hillside NW of the summit of Wideford Hill. The W-facing location is unusual, but the site commands a fine outward view over the lands of Firth and the sea, and looks towards the cairns of Cuween and Rousay. The area to be scheduled is that within the boundary fence. It is rectangular, 35m E-W by 28m N-S. The boundary fence and concrete roof are included. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Kirkwall and St Ola and the County of Orkney as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto



is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

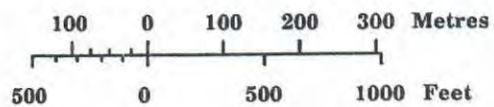
