ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as St Mary's Chapel, Wyre comprises a chapel of medieval date together with its burial ground. The area to be scheduled comprises the remains and the walled burial ground surrounding it, within which related material may be expected to be found. It is quadrangular and defined by the outer face of the graveyard wall, having maximum dimensions of 35m from its northernmost point to its southernmost point and 32m from its easternmost point. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Rousay and Egilsay and the County of Orkney as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto [REDACTED]

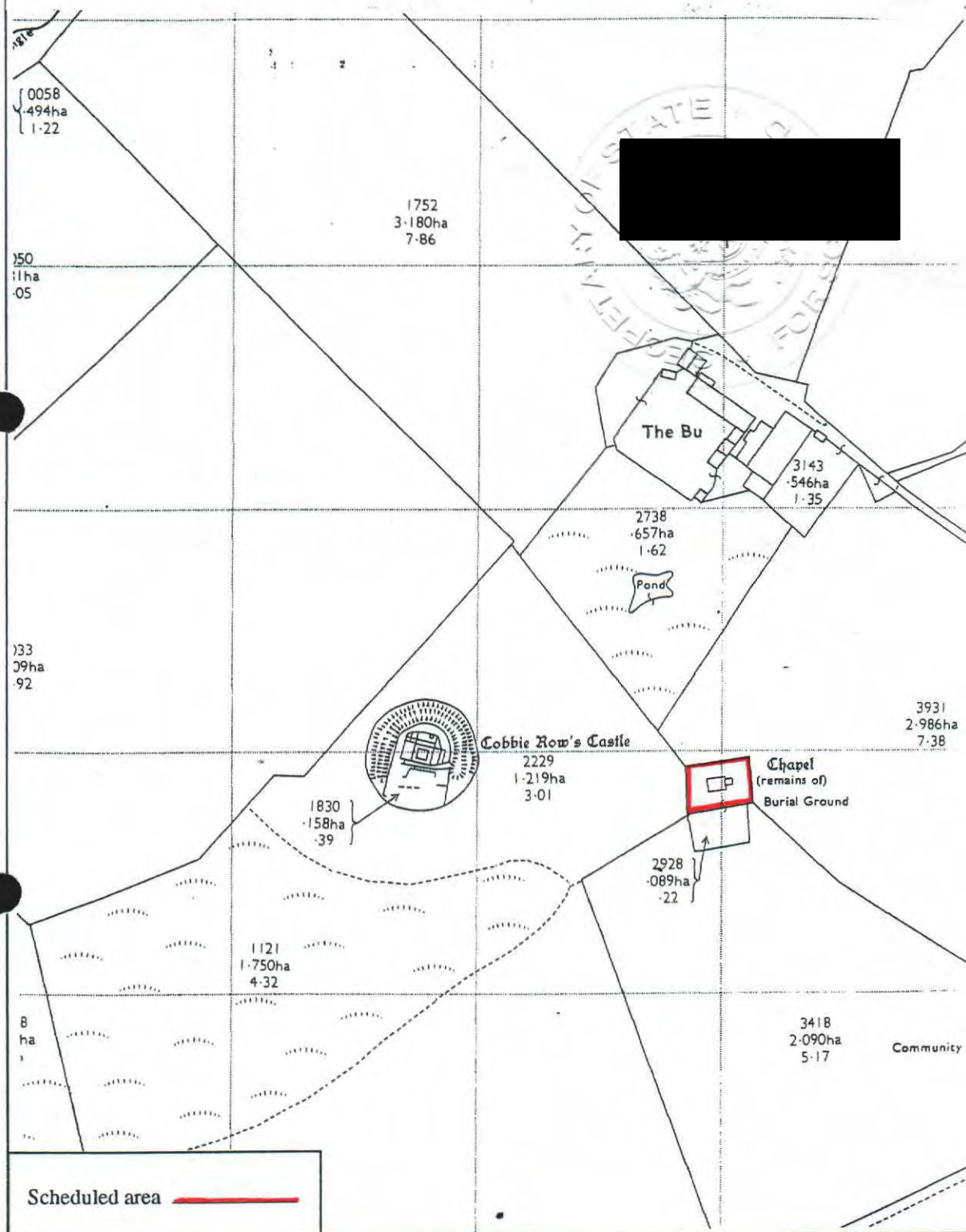
